Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials. FOIA 22-39404-F requested all photographs from Daniel Schuker's departure meeting with President Obama on August 3, 2010. This FOIA primarily contains the photographs from that meeting with President Obama, Daniel Schuker, and Schuker's family.

System of Arrangement

The materials in FOIA 22-39404-F are a systematic body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials. Records responsive to this FOIA were found in these collection areas – Obama Presidential Electronic Records The Executive Office of the President (EOP) instance of the Electronic Records Archive (ERA) contains electronic records created or received by Obama administration staff. These records are stored in Search and Access Sets (SAS) that represent their originating computer program, such as Exchange Email or the Worker and Visitor Entry System (WAVES). In addition to records captured from the White House's electronic systems, EOP-ERA also contains records from the home and shared drives used by White House staff.
