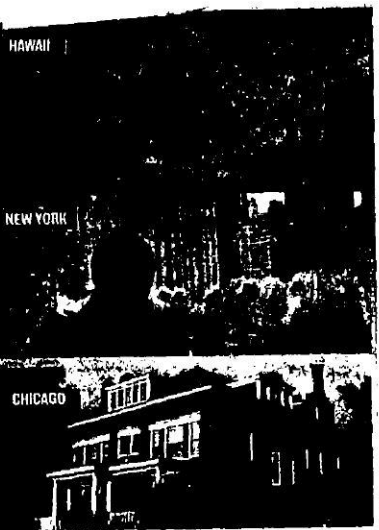

## Passenger wrests gun from man on Megabus

Struggle ensues after shot fired at start of 8-hour trip

Kenneth Smith was getting settled into his seat for his regular eight-hour Megabus commute from Chicago to Minneapolis to see his 6-year-old son when a shot went off in the bathroom of the bus late Tuesday.

Five minutes later, Smith was wrestling with the man who fired the gun.

"I was scared. He was being real irate. It was a really scary situation," Smith, 28, said Wednesday. "If he let one gunshot off, there was nothing stopping him from taking another shot."

Smith fought with the man on the floor and was able to pull the gun away as he and other passengers held the man down. The bus pulled over at the Des Plaines Oasis, and state troopers took the man into

custody.

No injuries were reported. The man was being held at the Des Plaines police station and was being uncooperative, state police said Wednesday. Authorities were waiting for the man's fingerprints to clear before charging him, they said.

The Megabus had left Chicago around 11 p.m. The gunshot occurred not long afterward as the bus headed west on Interstate 90, state police said.

Smith said the gun fired about 10 minutes into the bus ride. "It sounded like a gunshot would, but it also sounded like something was thrown at the bus,"

Smith said by phone.

Moments later, Smith said, he saw a man come down from the second level of the bus and start harassing the bus driver and trying to get into the driver's seat.

"I stood up. ... I grabbed him and told him to leave the bus driver alone," Smith said. "He told me to mind my business, so I pushed him."

The two fell to the floor, and Smith said he saw a clip fall out of the gun as they struggled. Smith said he managed to wrest the gun away.

Once the man was placed into custody, the passengers were trans-

ferred to another bus and were again headed toward Minneapolis, two hours behind schedule.

"Out of abundance of caution, the bus was changed and continued on their journey without additional incident," Sean Hughes, director of corporate affairs at Megabus, said in a statement.

Smith said he rides a Megabus to Minneapolis about twice a month to see his son, Kentrell.

"I prefer the bus because I don't have to worry if I fall asleep," he said. "It's safer."

# AUTHORITIES: MAN KILLED 2 FOR FIGHTING WITH HIS FATHER

**5** A 21-year-old South Side man was ordered held without bail Wednesday for allegedly shooting and killing two men who had fought with his father last summer, the Chicago Sun-Times reports.

Thomas Bishop Jr.'s father got into a "verbal and physical" altercation with Corey Hudson, Robert Cotten and others in the parking lot of a West Englewood strip mall because he felt he was being "disrespected," authorities said.

During the Fourth of July fight, Bishop left the strip mall at 63rd Street and Seeley Avenue and returned in a car with a loaded rifle, Assistant Cook County State's Attorney Kim Przeka said.

By that time, the fight had ended and Bishop's father had driven off with two others.

But Bishop still got out of the car, took out the rifle and shot at the two men, Przeka said.

Hudson, 35, suffered 10 gunshot wounds to the head and torso, and Cotten, 35, was shot four times.

A witness identified Bishop as the shooter and surveillance footage from a nearby business shows him leaving the area and then returning before the shots rang out, Przeka said.

Assistant Public Defender Margaret Downey said Bishop lived with his grandmother at 6200 block of South Wolcott Avenue. The police report lists Bishop's address as the 6200 block of South Wolcott Avenue.

Bishop has three unconvicted felonies, including as a felon in possession of a handgun.

## Man subdued after gun goes off in Megabus bathroom

**4** A man who accidentally discharged his weapon while using the bathroom inside a Megabus traveling on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway in Des Plaines Tuesday night was subdued by a passenger and held until police arrived.

About 11 p.m., a man who has yet to be identified, got into an argument with the driver after he discharged his weapon and asked to get off the bus, Illinois State Police said. The driver declined to let him off the bus, and the man went back to get his belongings from the back of the bus.

After securing his belongings he walked back toward the driver and stumbled, causing his pistol to fall out of his waistband, police said. A passenger quickly subdued the man and held him until troopers arrived.

No one was reported to have been injured.

## REPUTED GANG MEMBER CHARGED WITH '13 MURDER

**4** A reputed gang member was ordered held without bail Saturday, charged with robbing and killing a 68-year-old Logan Square man returning home from work in late 2013.

Joshua Johnson, 23, a twice-convicted burglar, was charged with murder and attempted armed robbery when he appeared in court Friday in Rolling Meadows in an unrelated case.

Johnson and another gang member approached Cayetano Sandoval after he parked his car in the 1900 block of North Spaulding Avenue around 2 a.m. on Dec. 12, 2013, after coming home from his job at a bakery, Cook County prosecutors said Saturday.

They said Johnson told Sandoval to give them his money and began hitting him and that the other man, who has not been charged, took out a gun and began shooting as Johnson held Sandoval down. Sandoval was shot five times.

Several people saw what happened,

according to, prosecutors, who said Johnson admitted he hit Sandoval and held him down while his friend shot him.

Court records list two addresses for Johnson — one in Elk Grove Village, the other on the South Side.

**3** A Seattle man who was shot in early May in the south suburbs and later charged with attempted murder has died.

### Dad accused of neglect after son shoots daughter in hand

**11** A Gary man is accused of neglect after his 6-year-old son shot his 3-year-old daughter in the hand while they were alone in his car, authorities say.

Christopher D. Starks-Vaulx, 29, is charged with neglect of a dependent resulting in serious bodily injury, among other charges.

According to court records, Starks-Vaulx left his son and daughter alone in his car May 8 and went to pick up his 9-month-old twins from a day-care center.

When Starks-Vaulx returned to the car, he found that a loaded gun he'd left in the car's center console had been moved, and his daughter was wounded, according to the records. He drove her to a hospital.

### MAN CHARGED WHO SHOT AT GEORGE ZIMMERMAN

The man who shot at George Zimmerman on Monday now faces three charges in the incident.

Matthew Apperson was arrested late Friday in Lake Mary, Fla., and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, aggravated battery with a deadly weapon and firing a deadly missile into an occupied conveyance.

Zimmerman, 31, who won a controversial acquittal in the 2012 shooting death of Trayvon Martin, an unarmed black teenager, was slightly injured Monday when he was shot at while driving his pickup truck in Central Florida, authorities said.

The day after the incident, Apperson's attorney, Mark NeJame, said his client acted in self-defense. Police said Zimmerman and Apperson appeared to have been in a previous road rage incident before the shooting.

Zimmerman was not struck by a bullet but was hit in the face by flying glass and debris, said his lawyer, Don West.

### Dozens of sick dogs rescued

**14** Authorities wearing hazmat suits removed nearly 40 dogs covered in feces from a home in Glencoe.

The dogs were taken to be cared for at animal hospitals and an adoption center. Five of the animals had to be euthanized because they were too sick or aggressive.

Glencoe Animal Hospital owner Sara Grogman says most of the other dogs had to be anesthetized before cleaning, which took around two hours for each dog.

The animals were discovered when police were called to the home by someone doing a well-being check.

Neighbors said a woman in her 60s lived in the house for many years.

### Cops: Woman lured man to robbery

**15** Four people were arrested Thursday after a woman lured a man into a park in west suburban Glendale Heights, where the man was attacked and robbed by three males.

Christina Hedges, 19, arranged for a meeting with the 22-year-old man through social media, and the pair met about 10:45 p.m. in the 100 block of Jacobsen Avenue, according to Glendale Heights police.

During the meeting, Hedges and the man walked to Camera Park, where he was attacked by three males who threw him to the ground, punched and kicked him several times, police said. The males then stole his wallet and cellphone.

The man called police, and Hedges and the three males were arrested a short time later without incident in the 1400 block of Westchester Drive, police said.

Hedges, of Glendale Heights, was charged with robbery, police said.

Michael Green, 18, and Shawn Milliner, 19, both from Hanover Park, were charged with one count each of robbery and aggravated battery, police said. A male juvenile, whose identity was not released because of his age, was also arrested.

# GUILTY PLEA IN SLAYING OF U. OF I. STUDENT FROM BACK OF THE YARDS

**7** A 21-year-old Champaign man has pleaded guilty to killing a University of Illinois student from Chicago last year during a drug-related robbery.

Reginald Scott agreed to plead guilty to first-degree murder in the January 2015 shooting death of 20-year-old Vicente Mundo, a U. of I. junior and statistics major from Back of the Yards whose body was found along a rural road south of Champaign after he'd been missing for a week.

Champaign County State's Attorney Julia Rietz said Scott agreed to a sentence of no

more than 60 years. He could have faced a life sentence.

Scott admitted shooting Mundo in a car in the parking garage of Mundo's building. He said he and another man had told Mundo they wanted to buy marijuana from him, robbed him of the drug and cash, killed him, dumped his body and smoked the marijuana with friends.

Daniel Gonzalez, 21, a friend of Mundo, also is charged with first-degree murder in his death and still faces trial.

Mundo was the youngest of five children, the only boy and first from his working-class family to go away to

college, according to relatives. After his parents divorced when he was very young, his father and older sisters raised him.

# Great-grandmother, 81, wounded in drive-by misses daughter's funeral

An 81-year-old great-grandmother, wounded in a drive-by shooting Friday after leaving her daughter's wake on the South Side, went home Saturday after a night in the hospital, her great-grandson said.

Iola Burress missed her daughter's funeral Saturday. But she survived being shot four times on the porch of her home in Auburn Gresham.

Her 34-year-old grandson, Sylvester Burress, also was wounded and has been released from the hospital, ac-

cording to family members, who said they think it must have been a case of mistaken identity.

Ronnie Mosley, Iola Burress' great-grandson,

said it's crazy that innocent people like his great-grandmother are put in danger.

"If this doesn't call us to act and work actively towards a solution," Mosley said, "I'm not sure anything else will."

Family members had expected Iola Burress would need surgery, but her doctors decided it wasn't immediately necessary, said Mosley, 23.

The shooting happened about 20 minutes after Iola Burress had returned to her home in the 7800 block of South Carpenter. Her family had been at a South Side funeral home Friday evening mourning Iola Burress'

youngest daughter, Laverne Burress, 60, who died after heart surgery.

The police said Iola Burress, who suffers from dementia, and her grandson were standing outside when they were shot by someone driving by in a sport-utility vehicle.

The elderly woman was shot in the right wrist and abdomen, and her grandson was shot in the hip, police said. Both were treated at Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn.

### FBI: HACKER BRIEFLY MADE PLANE FLY SIDEWAYS

A computer security expert hacked into a plane's inflight entertainment system and made it briefly fly sideways by telling one of the engines to go into climb mode.

Chris Roberts of One World Labs in Denver was flying on the plane at the

time it turned sideways, according to an F.B.I. search warrant filed in April.

The warrant was first publicized late Friday by APTN, a Canadian News Service.

Roberts told the F.B.I. he had hacked into planes "15 to 20 times," according to court documents first made public Friday.

Roberts first made news in April

when he was told he couldn't fly on United Airlines because of tweets he had made about whether he could hack into the flight's onboard computer settings.

ROBBERY SUSPECT  
SHOT TO DEATH BY  
COPS OUTSIDE CHURCH

**10** A man suspected in a string of dollar store robberies in south suburban Harvey was shot to death by police outside a church Sunday afternoon.

About 2:30 p.m., Harvey police responding to an armed robbery call at a Family Dollar—located at 15901 S. Halsted St.—spotted a man running from the store with a gun in his hand, police spokesman Sean Howard said.

Officers chased him on foot for about two blocks into Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church, where “over 200 people were eating dinner after Sunday services,” Howard said.

The man—described only as an adult—hid in a bathroom for a few minutes before running out to the church parking lot, where officers and residents were standing, Howard said. Then for unknown reasons, the man pulled out his gun, pointed it toward the crowd and fired multiple rounds.

“In fear and safety of his own life,” a Harvey officer fired back, striking and killing the man on the church’s doorstep, Howard

said.

The Cook County medical examiner’s office said he had not been notified of the death at 5:15 p.m.

No one else was injured. A gun, about \$100 and Mace were recovered from the scene. Police were still at the scene at 5 p.m. Police suspect the man may have robbed the same Family Dollar two weeks ago and a Dollar General last Sunday, Howard said.

Howard said multiple south suburbs have reported dollar store robberies in recent weeks. Authorities in those areas were asked to come to the scene Sunday to see whether the suspect was also involved in their burglaries.

Harvey police launched an undercover investigation at area dollar stores to investigate the string of burglaries this month, Howard said.

“Due to the aggressive approach Harvey police took in monitoring our dollar general stores in Harvey and quick alertness and tips from merchants, we were able to capture this particular subject.”

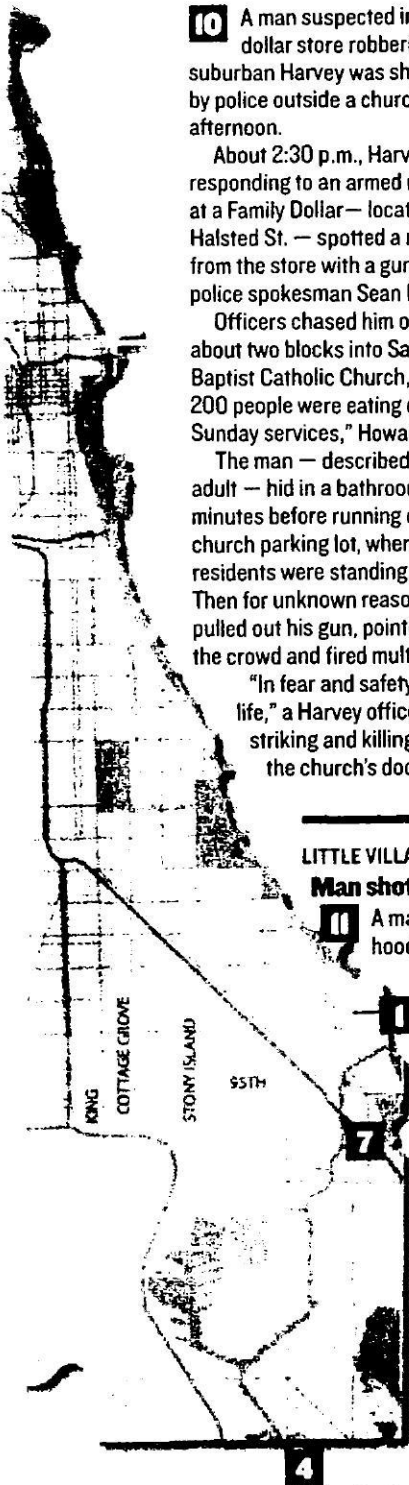

# 9 biker-gang members killed in Texas gunfight

Nine motorcycle gang members were killed Sunday when a gunfight broke out between three rival gangs at a restaurant in Waco, Texas, police said.

Waco police Sgt. W. Patrick Swanton confirmed "multiple fatalities" in the shootout at Twin Peaks Restaurant shortly after noon. Eighteen people were transferred to local hospitals with gunshot and stab wounds, KCEN-TV reported.

Remarkably, Swanton said, all of the dead or injured were gang members. Bystanders at the shopping center and a nearby restaurant were "all unscathed," he said. One officer at the scene was hospitalized because of a "heat-related issue," he said.

"Fortunately, none of our officers, nor any of our innocent civilians, were injured in this melee here today," he said.

Swanton said police expected to recover about 100 weapons from the crime scene

— one of the worst he'd ever encountered.

The initial fight, he said, began in the Twin Peaks restroom. He earlier told KWTX-TV that the fight quickly escalated from fists and feet to chains, clubs and knives, then to gunfire. Officers at the scene fired their weapons, as well, he said.

Swanton said police knew there could be trouble at the restaurant, as they'd learned that a gang recruitment event was taking place at Twin Peaks. He said that police tried to keep the gathering from taking place but that restaurant management didn't cooperate. "What happened here today could have been avoided if we'd had management at a local establishment listen to their police department and assist us," he said. "They failed to do that, and this is the event, what happened."

On its Facebook page, the Waco Police Department advised residents to "avoid the Central Texas Market Place as the area is NOT safe. Officers are continuing to arrest individuals coming to the scene with weapons."

#### Delivery drivers robbed at gunpoint

**1** Police issued an alert Monday warning of two recent armed robberies of delivery drivers on the Northwest Side.

The male drivers were each making a delivery when they were approached by groups who robbed them at gunpoint before running away, according to the community alert from Chicago Police.

The robberies happened at 12:22 a.m. April 25 in the 4100 block of North Marmora; and at 1:50 a.m. May 3 in the 4900 block of North Normandy.

The suspects in the Marmora robbery are described as three males, one of whom is described as a Hispanic man between 18-25, 5-foot-8 and 150-180 pounds. In the Normandy robbery, the suspects wore dark sweatshirts and bandanas, police said. Anyone with information is asked to call Area North detectives at (312) 744-8263.

#### \$5,000 reward in 2011 shooting

**9** The FBI is offering a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of a Chicago man charged in connection with a shooting at a Northwest Side playground that left two young girls injured in 2011.

Dionisio Gonzalez, 35, is charged with one count of aggravated battery with a handgun in connection with the June 8, 2011, shooting of the girls on a playground in the Avondale neighborhood, according to a statement from the FBI.

The girls, ages 2 and 7, were playing in the park around 8 p.m. when shots were fired during an ongoing gang dispute, according to the FBI. The 20-year-old suffered a graze wound to the back of her head, and the 7-year-old was shot in the back.

Chicago Police arrested the shooter, Antonio Bucio, a short time later, but Gonzalez, the alleged getaway driver, was never apprehended.

Gonzalez is described as a 5-foot-8, 135-160-pound Hispanic man with black hair and brown eyes. He has been known to have a mustache or a goatee.

He also has four tattoos: one on his chest that says "DEATH BEFORE DISHONOR"; one on his left arm that says "MANIAC"; another on his left forearm that says "LIL DIO"; and a fourth that says "LOGAN" and includes an image of a gun.

According to the FBI, his last known address in Chicago was in the 3000 block of West Belden. He also may be in Florida, according to the FBI. Anyone with information is asked to call the FBI's Chicago office at (312) 421-6700.

#### Boy, 17, hurt in drive-by shooting

**4** A teenage boy was hurt in a drive-by shooting Monday morning in the Rogers Park neighborhood on the North Side.

# FELON'S ALLEGED SOCIAL MEDIA STUMBLE

**6** An alleged West Side gang member and convicted felon is facing federal weapons charges after authorities claimed he shot a gun at a suburban firing range and then bragged about it on Instagram.

Labar Spann, 36, faces up to 10 years in prison if convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm, according to a statement Thursday from the U.S. Attorney's office.

Spann, a onetime member of the Four Corner Hustlers known as "Broman," was one of several reputed West Side gang leaders called to a meeting with then-Police Supt. Jody Weis in 2010 in an effort to stem gang violence.

The complaint, filed in U.S. District Court, claims Spann went with two women to Midwest Sporting Goods in Lyons on Sept. 14, 2014, where one of the women rented a Glock 19C .9mm handgun.

A store employee told authorities he or she saw the three head to the firing line, where Spann loaded and shot the firearm at a target, the complaint said. Spann allegedly also loaded the weapon for both women with him, who each took a turn shooting.

Video surveillance showed Spann and the two women in the store that day, the complaint said.

Prosecutors claim Spann took to Instagram during the time he was at the store, posting videos of two people inside a gun range, with the sound of a gun firing in the background.

According to the complaint, one of the video's captions read, "Yea this the type of s— I do with

my b—— ... I'm chasing loyalty and [bag of money emoticon]."

Another photo posted to Spann's Instagram account minutes later showed a shooting target with holes in it, prosecutors claim. Its caption said, "y'all know I had to go first just to show my b—— how this s— work lmao I do this s—," according to the complaint.

Spann's Instagram account was marked as private as of Thursday afternoon.

Spann has several felony convictions stretching back to 1996, including harassment of a witness, armed robbery and bringing contraband into a penal institution, according to federal authorities.

At the time of the 2010 meeting with police, Spann insisted he was not a gang chief, and a relative said he was no longer active in the gang, the Sun-Times reported at the time.

Spann, who uses a wheelchair because he was wounded in a shooting, was also charged with but ultimately cleared in the 2003 murder of Latin Kings gangster Rudy Rangel Jr.

Rapper DMX memorialized Rangel's death in the song "A Yo Kato."

The federal complaint was unsealed Thursday after Spann appeared in U.S. District Court before Magistrate Judge Michael T. Mason. He was ordered to remain in custody pending a detention hearing Monday.

## GRANDMA, 81, SHOT AFTER VIEWING DAUGHTER'S BODY

**3** An 81-year-old grandmother was shot Friday night just minutes after viewing the body of her recently deceased daughter at a South Side funeral home.

Iola Burress survived being shot four times but was due to undergo surgery Saturday, relatives said. Her 34-year-old grandson, Sylvester Burress, was also shot in the drive-by shooting in Auburn-Gresham.

"It's very hard right now because we're trying to bury her daughter and assist her and then this happens today during the wake," said Yolanda McBride, Burress' granddaughter. McBride's mother, Laverne Burress, 60, is the daughter the 81-year-old was mourning.

Chicago Police said that Iola Burress and her grandson were standing outside in the 7800 block of South Carpenter when they were shot by someone who was in a passing white SUV.

The grandmother, who suffers from dementia, was shot in the right wrist and abdomen, while her grandson was shot in the hip, police said. They were both taken to Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn, where their conditions were described as stable.

"It makes you very nervous that she has to go into surgery at this time," said McBride, 38, a social worker.

McBride said she doesn't know why gunmen shot at her family but thinks it might have been a case of mistaken identity.

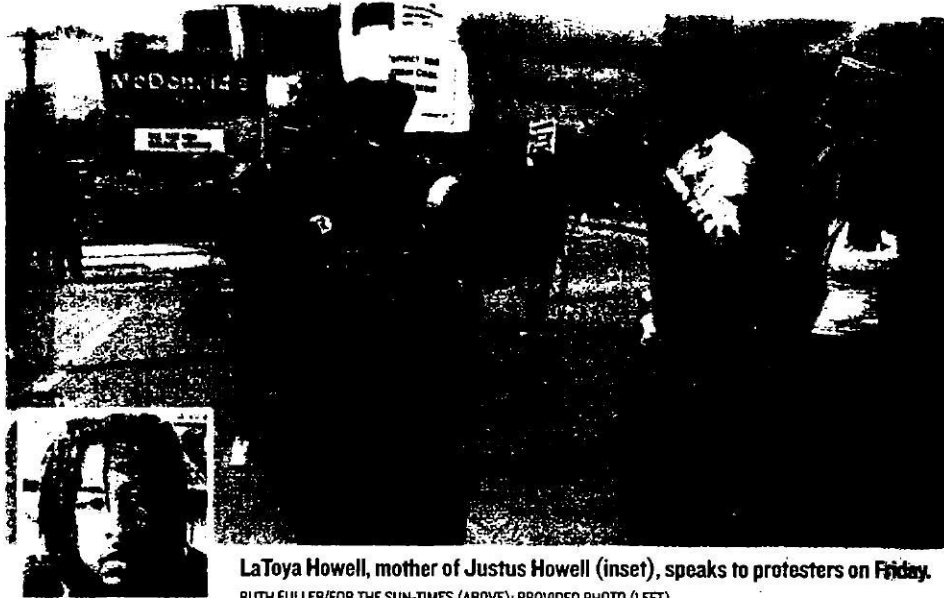
"I'm disappointed ... the male population, that they feel you can just shoot ... my grandmother's life was put at risk," she said. "We're just praying that she pulls through."

And Iola Burress will miss her daughter's funeral Saturday because she will be in the hospital.

# Protests of police shooting close Waukegan streets

Dozens of protesters shut down streets in Waukegan on Friday, decrying the decision by Lake County's top prosecutor that the police shooting death of a 17-year-old black boy was justified.

Among those protesting were members of the family of the teen, Justus Howell. They condemned the decision by Lake County State's Attorney Michael Nerheim not to charge Zion Police officer Eric Hill, who fatally shot Howell twice in the back last month.

"They took my baby's life and they called it justice," Justus Howell's mother LaToya Howell said through a bullhorn to the crowd. "We will get justice for our kids, and we are not going to stand around and let them shoot us down."

Officials apparently expected a much larger crowd.

They shut down the courthouse at 1 p.m. Friday, and law enforcement officers could be seen on the roof of the building as protesters gathered for the 3 p.m. event. Police were stationed at multiple corners and followed the peaceful marchers everywhere they walked to direct traffic.

Waukegan Mayor Wayne Motley spoke to the protesters outside as they confronted him over the decision.

"It was a thorough investigation," Motley said to the outraged crowd. Motley said he respected and agreed with Nerheim's decision but later told reporters that he understood that the crowd had a right to protest.

"My major concern is the safety of the people protesting," he said, adding that many of the protesters were friends of his.

One of the only run-ins with police came when pro-

tester Damonte Martin tried to stop a Pace bus. When police asked him to leave, the crowd surrounded him and eventually police asked the bus to back up down the street and turn around.

Several of the protesters came from Chicago, including Mark Clements, a torture victim of disgraced former Chicago cop Jon Burge.

"The nation has literally seen him gunned down in his back," Clements said, referring to video footage of Howell's death. "Too many people all across the country are losing their lives."

LaToya Howell said that she wants people to join her in her fight to vindicate the death of her son, who she said was taken much too soon.

"He was about to graduate high school," she said. "My son loved music, my son loved art. They killed him with his dreams and aspirations."

**9** Before he died, Bernard Welch identified one of the men who shot him by his nickname, Cook County prosecutors said.

This week — more than three years after the shooting on Nov. 30, 2011 — David Newell, the purported gang member whom Welch identified, was charged with his murder.

Two of Newell's cohorts, Robert Goodman and Demetrius Spencer, were charged in the case in 2013. A fourth person remains at large, Assistant State's Attorney Akash Vyas said.

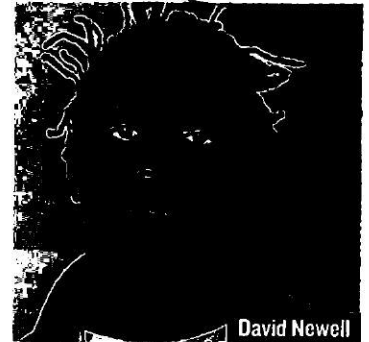
Goodman and the uncharged man were lookouts in the incident at the street corner in the 5700 block of South Winchester Avenue, Vyas said.

Spencer shot Welch, 20, three times, hitting him in the chest, neck and a leg, Vyas said.

Newell also allegedly fired a weapon toward Welch, who was standing in a gangway when he was attacked.

Prosecutors did not explain why it took several years to charge 20-year-old Newell.

Vyas said Welch's cousin saw four men fleeing from the scene and recognized Spencer.

Another witness recognized Newell, Vyas said.

The .45-caliber shell casings and bullets recovered matched the handgun Spencer had used in the shooting, Vyas said.

Welch died on Jan. 9, 2012, from injuries he suffered in the shooting.

Newell, of the 5500 block of South Maplewood Avenue, was ordered held on \$1.5 million bail Thursday for Welch's murder.

Newell was already in Cook County Jail for a 2012 attempted murder charge. His bench trial in his attempted murder trial is expected to resume next month.

# SOURCES: FEDS PROBE ANOTHER CPD SHOOTING

The FBI is investigating a police shooting of two teenage boys during a 2013 stop of a car on the South Side, the Chicago Sun-Times has learned.

The teens were wounded on Dec. 22 near 95th and La Salle after Chicago Police officers curbed a stolen car packed with joyriders, the department said in a statement after the incident.

The driver ran away and a passenger moved into the driver's seat and threw the car into reverse, the department said. Fearing for those in the car, an officer fired his weapon and struck two teens in the vehicle, the department said.

Pat Camden, a spokesman for the Fraternal Order of Police, gave a different version at the time. He said the driver backed up toward officers as a passenger tried to exit. Officers ordered the driver to stop, but the car moved forward and dragged the passenger, he said.

Concerned with the safety of the passenger being dragged, an officer fired on the car, Camden said. There wasn't an exchange of gunfire, but a replica weapon was found in the car, he told reporters.

FBI agents have recently approached officers involved in the incident, according to a source familiar with the case.

A law-enforcement source confirmed that the FBI is investigating the shooting. Officials with the FBI and the Chicago Police Department declined to comment.

A spokesman for the Independent Police Review Authority, which investigates every police-involved shoot-

ing, said its investigation of the incident is continuing.

It's unclear why the FBI is looking at the shooting, which has received scant attention in the media — unlike the controversy surrounding the fatal police shooting of Laquan McDonald, a teenager shot 16 times on Oct. 20.

McDonald's death also is the subject of an FBI investigation, which the city's corporation counsel disclosed to a City Council committee in April. The committee agreed to pay McDonald's family \$5 million even before a lawsuit was filed.

One of the questions in the 2013 shooting at 95th and La Salle is whether the officer violated a longstanding policy that prevents cops from shooting at vehicles in most situations.

In 2002, then-police Supt. Terry Hillard created new rules on firing at vehicles two years after an officer shot at a stolen car containing a toddler in the back seat. The officer said he feared the car would run over him.

Under that policy, "Firing

at or into a moving vehicle is only authorized to prevent death or great bodily harm to the sworn member or another person. When confronted with an oncoming vehicle and that vehicle is the only force used against them, sworn members will move out of the vehicle's path."

In February, McCarthy revised the department's policy, which now flatly prevents officers from "firing at or into a moving vehicle when the vehicle is the only force used against the sworn member or another person."

"Several months ago Superintendent McCarthy changed department policy to clarify that officers are prevented from firing at or into a moving vehicle when the vehicle is the only force used against the sworn member or another person (as the language says). This updated directive is more restrictive and in line with best practices that other departments are using around the country," said Martin Maloney, a spokesman for the department.

# State's attorney: Zion cop justified in fatal shooting

A Zion police officer feared for his life and was justified in firing twice at a fleeing 17-year-old after the teen turned toward him with a gun in his hand, the Lake County state's attorney said Thursday.

The fatal shooting of Justus Howell on April 4 sparked protests and outrage. The Lake County coroner ruled the death a homicide.

But on Thursday, State's Attorney Mike Nerheim announced the results of his investigation, saying Officer Eric Hill was justified in deciding to shoot the teen twice in the back.

Nerheim played a video, which showed Howell fleeing from Hill. Nerheim said when taken frame-by-frame, it was evident that Howell turned slightly and had a gun in his hand; however, this was not evident watching the video in real time.

The finding angered Howell's family.

"That's Lake County for you," said his grandmother, Alice Howell. "The perception of the video by the state's attorney is just his perception, and that is not how we see it. There are no videos or pictures of him actually holding a gun."

A small group of protesters gathered outside the Lake County Courthouse after the announcement and said a larger protest is planned for the same location at 3 p.m. Friday.

Ralph Peterson, a community activist from Wauke-

gan, called the ruling "unjust and unfair."

"The state's attorney is basing his ruling off of the officer's version of the story with no facts to support it," he said.

Nerheim said he did not come to his conclusion lightly.

"Deadly force should be used only as a last resort," he said. "Officer Hill provided ample opportunity to drop the weapon and only fired when he felt that his life and the life of his fellow officer was in danger."

The incident started when Howell met Tramond Peet, 18, of Lindenhurst, about 1:55 p.m. Howell intended to buy a handgun from Peet for \$600, Ner-

heim said. Howell took the gun, which had been stolen from a home in Lake Villa, and refused to pay Peet. He then pointed it at Peet and a fight ensued and the gun discharged, Nerheim said.

Police responded within a minute or two, and Howell took off running with the weapon in his right hand, Nerheim said. Hill, a nine-year veteran of the department, chased Howell while ordering him to drop the gun, Nerheim said.

"As Howell continued to flee... Officer Hill observed Howell lean forward and turn slightly toward him with the handgun in his right hand," Nerheim said. "Fearing for his life, as well as the life of the officer that was in

Howell's direction of travel, Officer Hill reacted by firing two shots in rapid succession at Howell."

The gun was found within a foot of Howell's body, and his right thumbprint and DNA were found on the gun, Nerheim said.

According to Nerheim, "multiple witnesses" saw Howell with a gun in his right hand while ignoring the officer's commands to stop.

Howell's family hopes he is not remembered for his death, but for the boy they loved.

"Justus was a loveable, intelligent and bright person," Alice Howell said in an interview last month. "The picture [the police] are painting of him isn't true."

## Man enters guilty plea in U. of I. student's death

URBANA — A 21-year-old Champaign man has pleaded guilty to killing a University of Illinois student from Chicago this year during a drug-related robbery.

Reginald Scott entered the plea Tuesday to a charge of first-degree murder in the January shooting death of Vicente Mundo.

Champaign County State's Attorney Julia Rietz said Scott agreed to plead guilty in exchange for a sentence of no more than 60 years. He could

have faced a life sentence if convicted at trial.

The (Champaign) News-Gazette reports Scott admitted shooting the 20-year-old Mundo as Scott and another man robbed him of marijuana and cash.

They had told Mundo they wanted to buy marijuana from him.

Daniel Gonzalez, 21, also faces a first-degree murder charge in Mundo's death. He has pleaded not guilty.

## SMALL HELICOPTER DEVICE NABBED NEAR WHITE HOUSE; ARREST MADE

The U.S. Park Police made an arrest Thursday after uniformed Secret Service officers saw a man flying a small, remote-controlled aircraft over Lafayette Park north of the White House.

The helicopter-like device flew as high as 100 feet in the air before officers spotted it, detained its owner and asked him

to land it, Secret Service spokesman Brian Leary said. The Metropolitan Police

Department examined the device and declared it safe.

## Man flying drone arrested near White House

WASHINGTON — The Secret Service apprehended a man who was flying a small drone Thursday afternoon in a park outside the White House.

Secret Service spokesman Brian Leary said the drone, about the size of an iPad, was flying at about 100 feet over Lafayette Park, which is across Pennsylvania Avenue from the north fence of the White House.

Leary said the operator

was detained and asked to land the device. He said the man complied and that the officers recovered the drone in the park.

Leary said the man was turned over to the U.S. Park Police.

The incident occurred shortly after 1 p.m. local time and placed the White House on lockdown for more than an hour. President Barack Obama was away at the time, hosting a meeting with Persian Gulf leaders at Camp David in Maryland.

The drone appeared to be a Parrot BeBop drone, which is equipped with a high-definition camera for capturing video and photographs and is sold commercially for \$500 to \$900.

The drone can stream images to its remote controller over a wireless connection, allowing it to be flown for up to 11 minutes at speeds up to 45 mph even outside the operator's field of vision. Its engines can carry just under one-half pound of extra equipment.

The arrest occurred one


day after the Federal Aviation Administration launched a campaign to remind the public that Washington and communities within a 15-mile radius of Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport are part of a "No Drone Zone."

The rules were adopted after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks.


The incident comes nearly four months after a quadcopter drone piloted by an off-duty U.S. intelligence employee landed on the White House lawn.
