**INTERNATIONAL TRANSACTIONS**

- **The U.S. current account deficit—a net measure of transactions between the United States and the rest of the world in goods, services, and income—narrowed \$5.3 billion in the third quarter of 2016 to \$113.0 billion.** As a percentage of GDP, the current account deficit dropped to 2.4 percent in the third quarter, down from 2.6 percent in the second quarter. The narrowing of the current account deficit primarily reflected a decrease in the deficit on goods.
  - *The deficit in trade of goods and services narrowed \$8.3 billion in Q3 from Q2.* The goods deficit narrowed \$9.0 billion in the third quarter to \$177.7 billion, with exports increasing more than imports. A substantial jump in agricultural exports played a major role in the export increase. The services surplus declined \$0.7 billion to \$61.3 billion, with services imports increasing slightly more than services exports.
  - *Investment income receipts on U.S. holdings of financial assets abroad increased \$0.2 billion to reach \$201.0 billion.* This increase primarily reflected an increase in direct investment receipts, which more than offset a drop in income on U.S. investors' portfolio investment abroad and on reserve assets. Payments of investment income to foreigners on U.S. liabilities increased \$1.0 billion, more than the increase in receipts. The deficit on secondary income grew \$2.2 billion in the third quarter, to \$39.9 billion.
  - *Net U.S. borrowing measured by financial-account transactions rose \$167.0 billion to \$207.9 billion in the third quarter of 2016.* Net acquisitions of foreign assets by U.S. investors in the third quarter of 2016 fell by more than did net purchases of U.S. assets by foreign investors. In addition, net transactions in financial derivatives other than reserves reflected an increase in net U.S. cash payments arising from derivatives contracts in 2016:Q3 (net outflow) over 2016:Q2 of \$9.2 billion.
  - *The statistical discrepancy, a measure of unaccounted-for inflows and outflows, was negative (net outflow), after being positive the last nine consecutive quarters.* The third-quarter discrepancy of \$95.0 billion is higher than in the second quarter (in absolute value) and indicates that while the current account transactions suggest the United States had to borrow \$113.0 billion to cover trade and income flows, the financial account shows \$207.9 billion in borrowing. The discrepancy, which should fluctuate around zero, shows the gap.

- Global risk assets advanced today despite headwinds from higher sovereign yields and the stronger dollar, as U.S. economic data surprised to the upside and investors continued to digest yesterday's Federal Reserve policy meeting. Yields on 10-year Treasuries rose 3 basis points to 2.60%, their highest level in over two years, further steepening the yield curve and helping bank stocks to outperform. The S&P 500 gained 0.4%, while the Nikkei and Euro Stoxx index closed 0.1% and 1.2% higher, respectively. However, Chinese equities declined amid tightening domestic monetary conditions (more below). The trade-weighted dollar appreciated 0.5%, reaching its strongest level in over 14 years, while developed and emerging market currencies continued to broadly depreciate.
- Market participants remain highly attuned to the dollar's recent rally, with several different indexes of dollar valuation reaching their highest levels since 2002 in today's trading. Market contacts attribute the last two days' bout of appreciation, during which the trade-weighted dollar has gained 1.2%, to the tone of yesterday's FOMC meeting, which was perceived as less accommodative than expected. Market participants have reacted by positioning for a faster pace of U.S. interest rate increases, with futures markets currently pricing in the next 25 basis point hike by July 2017. Yields on Treasuries have risen sharply, driven by higher real yields as opposed to increased inflation expectations. As U.S. assets become more attractive relative to the rest of the world, investors have shifted funds out of emerging markets (EM), pressuring EM currencies and boosting the dollar.
- Investors noted a series of positive U.S. economic releases today, supporting consensus fourth quarter GDP forecasts of 2.2% annualized growth. Business surveys from the New York and Philadelphia Federal Reserve Banks both beat expectations and approached multi-year highs. The National Association of Home Builders published its December sentiment index, which showed that optimism among housing industry participants is at its highest level since 2005. Some analysts had worried that the recent rise in mortgage rates, with the benchmark 30-year rate up over 50 basis points since the U.S. election to 4.05%, might depress housing demand. While today's strong data could be due to seasonal and technical factors, it nevertheless alleviated concerns and boosted investor sentiment.

**China:** Overnight, the PBoC fixed the renminbi 0.38% weaker versus the dollar at 6.9289 to its weakest level in over eight years. Separately, 10-year sovereign bond yields rose 15 basis points and domestic money market conditions tightened. Analysts speculate that policymakers may desire tighter financial conditions to address recent inflation pressures and to counteract depreciation pressures on the renminbi.

**UK:** As expected, the Bank of England (BoE) maintained its current policy stance today, leaving benchmark interest rates unchanged at 0.25%. Investors do not expect significant changes to the BoE's policy framework until the UK's future relationship with the EU becomes clearer, likely by late 2017.

**Mexico:** The central bank of Mexico (Banxico) raised its benchmark interest rate by 50 basis points to 5.75%, double the consensus expectation of a 25 basis point hike. Banxico policymakers remain concerned that the peso's 15.4% depreciation versus the dollar this year could begin to feed through to higher domestic inflation. The peso appreciated 1.0% after the announcement.

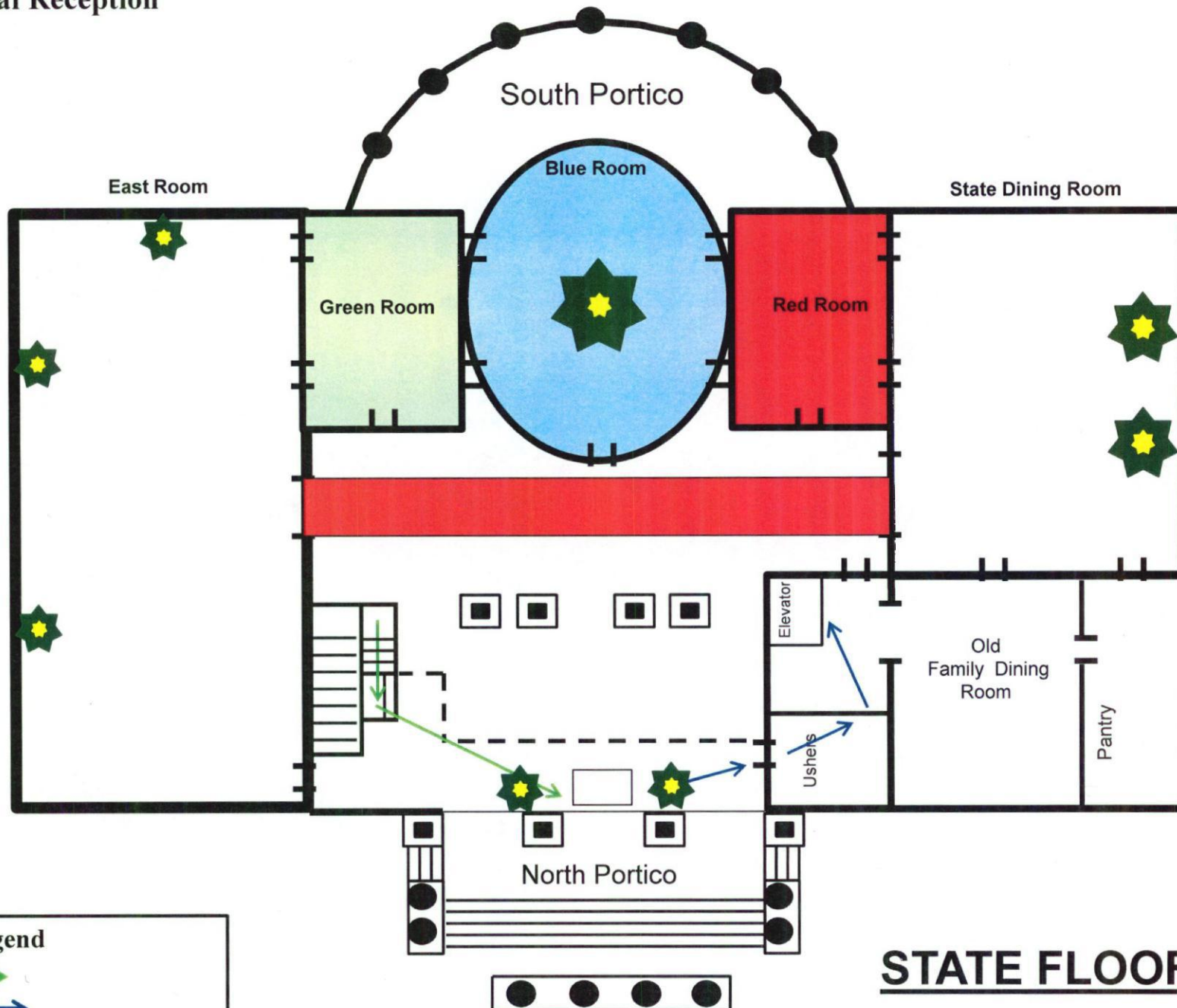

## TALENT AND FILMMAKER BIOS

**GARETH EDWARDS (Director)** hails from Nuneaton, a small town in the midlands of England, where from a young age he dreamed of becoming a film director. Through a combination of creativity and innovation, he successfully made a career in the visual effects world, winning a number of awards, including a BAFTA for the BBC documentary "Hiroshima."

Inspired by a guerilla approach to filmmaking, Edwards went on to make "Monsters," a sci-fi thriller about an alien attack on Earth and its effect on a cynical American journalist, played by Scoot McNairy. With a minimal crew, he served as writer, director and cinematographer, and completed almost all the creature design and visual effect shots single handedly.

"Monsters" was a huge critical success, earning Edwards a BAFTA nomination for outstanding debut by a British writer, director or producer, three British Independent Film Awards, including best director and best technical achievement, as well as a multitude of other wins around the world, drawing the attention of Hollywood and leading to the opportunity to direct Legendary's epic rebirth of arguably the most recognized monster of the 20<sup>th</sup> century: "Godzilla."

**ALLISON SHEARMUR (Producer)** is one of the leading film and television producers working today, shepherding to the screen some of the most successful properties in Hollywood. As a studio executive she played a pivotal role in the launch of three film franchises grossing more than a billion dollars each: the "Bourne Identity" films, "American Pie" and the "Hunger Games," the latter of which she also executive produced.

Projects on Shearmur's development slate include the Newberry Award-winning "The One and Only Ivan," a project being developed with director Mike Newell for Disney from a screenplay by Mike White; Disney's "The Paper Magician," based on Charlie N. Holmberg's popular trilogy of fantasy novels; "Devil in the Grove," the Thurgood Marshall story with Anton Corbijn attached to direct; a reimagining of "Sister Act" at Disney; and a film adaptation of "The Reason You're Alive," from Matthew Quick, best-selling author of "The Silver Linings Playbook," for Miramax that Jay Roach directed.

Earlier in her career, Shearmur was vice president of production for Walt Disney Pictures, where she developed and supervised "George of the Jungle," directed by Sam Weisman and starring Brendan Fraser, among other films.

Shearmur is a member of the Producers Guild of America and the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, she received a J.D. degree from the USC Law Center and is a member of the California State Bar. Since the early '90s, Shearmur has been an avid supporter of the Los Angeles contemporary art community. She has also been a longstanding board member at both the Laurence School and the Pacific Oaks Children's School.



**TONY GILROY (Screenplay by)** made his feature film directorial debut with “Michael Clayton,” which earned seven Oscar® nominations, including one for best picture. The film garnered him Academy Award® nominations for best director and best original screenplay, as well as Directors Guild® and Writers Guild® award nominations. The writer/director/producer then followed “Michael Clayton” with his second directorial effort based on his own screenplay, the critically acclaimed thriller “Duplicity,” starring Julia Roberts and Clive Owen.

A veteran screenwriter, Gilroy also spent seven years working on the first three Bourne films: “The Bourne Identity,” “The Bourne Supremacy” and “The Bourne Ultimatum.” In 2012, Gilroy co-wrote and directed the fourth installment of the series, “The Bourne Legacy,” starring Jeremy Renner, Rachel Weisz and Edward Norton.

Gilroy also served as a consulting producer on Netflix’s hit series “House of Cards,” during the show’s third and fourth seasons. Most recently, he produced and wrote the screenplay for an upcoming 2017 political thriller, starring Jon Hamm and Rosamund Pike.

Raised in upstate New York, Gilroy is the son of Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright and filmmaker Frank D. Gilroy. His brother Dan Gilroy is a screenwriter who co-wrote the screenplay for “The Bourne Legacy,” and his brother John Gilroy is a film editor who also worked on “Michael Clayton,” “Duplicity” and “The Bourne Legacy.” The Gilroy brothers also collaborated on the 2014 hit thriller “Nightcrawler,” starring Jake Gyllenhaal, Rene Russo and Riz Ahmed, on which Gilroy served as a producer.

**JOHN SWARTZ**, Co-Producer, is no stranger to the *Star Wars* universe, having been a part of Lucasfilm since 2012 and served as Co-Producer on the latest chapter in the *Star Wars* saga, *The Force Awakens*.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Swartz graduated with a Masters degree from Ohio University in 2006. He then began his career in story development at MTV Films, followed by Aversano Films. In 2008, he began assisting Kathleen Kennedy at the Kennedy/Marshall Company. Swartz then served as Kennedy’s production associate on Steven Spielberg’s *Lincoln*, *War Horse* and *The Adventures of Tintin*.

Swartz continued to work with Kennedy after her move to Lucasfilm as executive associate, running the day-to-day operations of the company president’s office while also working on the development and production of *The Force Awakens*. Since 2014, Swartz has held the position of Director, Production & Development at Lucasfilm.

**MARK HAMILL**, is an American actor and writer best known for his portrayal of Luke Skywalker in the *Star Wars* film series. Him and his wife plan to stay to watch the film with the students.

- **Recession:** From the U.S. employment peak in January 2008 to the trough in February 2010, employment in Hawaii fell at a faster pace than the nation as a whole. Most of the job loss was due to Mining, Logging & Construction (24%), Leisure & Hospitality (23%), and Professional & Business Services (14%).
- **Recovery:** Since the U.S. employment trough in February 2010, employment in Hawaii has grown at a slightly faster pace than the nation as a whole. However, since Hawaii lost a larger share of jobs from January 2008 to February 2010, it has regained a smaller share of the employment lost over that period (165% compared to 177% nationally), led by growth in Leisure & Hospitality and Professional & Business Services. The Honolulu metropolitan area has regained 188% of employment lost over this same period, but Kailua is only a small part of the broader area.

**KEY SECTORS**

- **Largest sectors:** Government (19%), Leisure & Hospitality (18%), and Professional & Business Services (13%) account for the largest shares of employment in Hawaii. Compared to the nation as a whole, Hawaii has a high share of employment in Leisure & Hospitality and Government.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT JOBS**

- In Hawaii, the local government sector employed 18,600 workers in October 2008. In October 2016, the local government sector employed 19,000 workers, 400 greater than in October 2008, and unchanged from October 2015.

**VETERANS**

- In 2015, 107,469 veterans resided in Hawaii, including 78,431 in the Honolulu metropolitan area, and 33,316 Hawaii veterans served after September 2001. The unemployment rate for all working-age veterans in Hawaii was 2.4% in 2015.

## CONSUMER PRICES

- **Gas prices:** On December 14th, the price of regular gas in Hawaii was \$2.93 per gallon (1st highest in the nation), compared to \$2.23 nationwide. Over the last month, the price in Hawaii increased \$0.03. The highest recorded gas price in Hawaii was \$4.62 per gallon on April 11, 2012.
- **Milk prices:** For the period between December 2 and December 8 (the most recent period for which data are available), the average advertised price of milk in Hawaii was \$4.90 per gallon, compared to \$2.46 nationwide.

- **Foreclosures:** 3.9% of all mortgages in Hawaii are 90 days past due or in the process of foreclosure as of 2016:Q3, the 9<sup>th</sup> highest in the nation (compared to 3.0% nationally).
- **Housing programs:** As of 2016:Q3, 3,148 permanent modifications had been started under the Home Affordable Modification Program (HAMP) in the Honolulu metropolitan area, with a median monthly payment reduction of \$755 (compared to \$476 nationally). As of September 2016, 9,296 Hawaii homeowners had refinanced their mortgages through the Home Affordable Refinance Program (HARP).

## HEALTH CARE

- **Marketplace and Medicaid coverage:** At the end of the third Marketplace open enrollment period, 14,564 people in Hawaii selected or were automatically re-enrolled in a 2016 Marketplace plan. In addition, Hawaii has expanded Medicaid, and as of September 2016, 54,644 more people were covered by the State's Medicaid program than before the Marketplace opened in mid-2013.
- **Closing the "Donut Hole":** According to HHS, 24,000 Hawaii Medicare beneficiaries saved an average of \$1,264 on prescription drugs in 2015 as a result of the Affordable Care Act.
- **Young adults:** HHS estimates that as of December 2011, 6,000 previously uninsured 19-25 year olds in Hawaii had health insurance because the ACA allows young adults to remain on a parent's plan.
- **Uninsurance rates:** About 1 in 25 people (4.0%) lacked health insurance in Hawaii in 2015. The national uninsurance rate in 2015 was 9.4%.

## **BACKGROUND ON GREETERS**

### **Bruni Bradley, Admiral Harris's wife**

Bruni Bradley is a graduate of the United States Naval Academy and of the Georgetown School of Business. She served in the U.S. Navy for over 25 years. She had a variety of assignments including: aviation squadron operations and administration, recruiting, facility management, and humanitarian civic assistance. She had duty assignments in Japan, the Philippines, Germany and various locations throughout the United States.

### **Kirk Caldwell, Mayor of Honolulu (D)**

Caldwell was reelected in 2016 and is currently serving his third term. Previously, he served as Acting Mayor of Honolulu in 2010 following the resignation of Mayor Mufi Hannemann. Prior to this, Caldwell served in the Hawaii State House of Representatives from 2002 to 2008. He served as the House Majority Leader between 2007 and 2008. He and his wife, Donna, have one child named Maya.

### **Harry Harris, Admiral, Commander of the U.S. Pacific Command**

Admiral Harris commanded VP-46, Patrol and Reconnaissance Wing 1, Joint Task Force-Guantanamo, the U.S. 6th Fleet, Striking and Support Forces NATO, and the U.S. Pacific Fleet. Admiral Harris was promoted to Admiral and assumed command of the U.S. Pacific Fleet in October 2013. He was designated as the Theater Joint Force Maritime Component Commander. In May 2015, he assumed command of the U.S. Pacific Command. He is a recipient of the Navy League's Stephen Decatur, the CIA's Agency Seal Medal, the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, and APAICS Lifetime Achievement awards. He is the Navy's current "Gray Owl" – the NFO who has held this designation for the longest period.

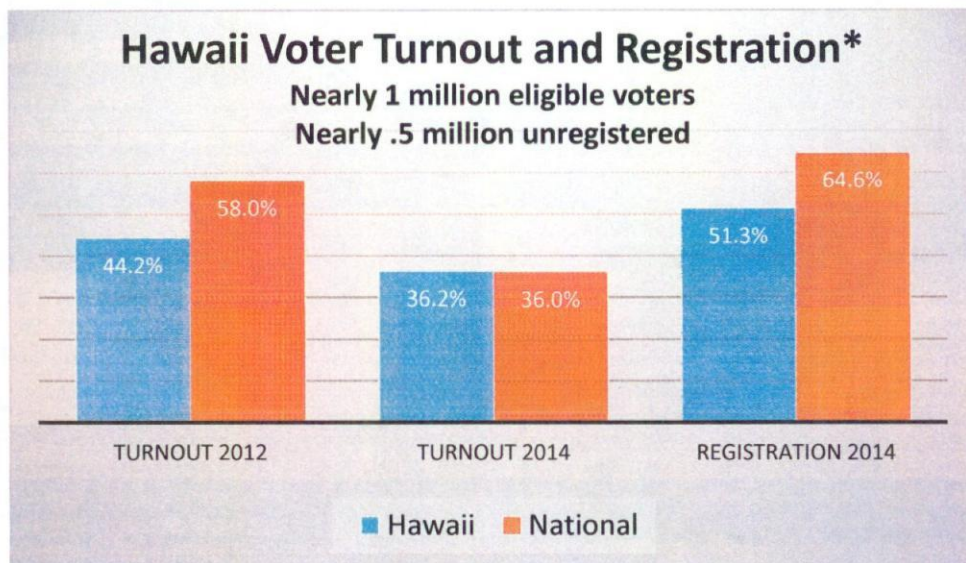

## State Voting Requirements

- Voter turnout in 2012 and voter registration in 2014 were significantly below the national average. Voter turnout in 2014 was on par with the national average.
- While election officials continue to tabulate votes and certify results, preliminary data shows that voter turnout in Hawaii declined by approximately 7 percentage points to 55% of registered voters from approximately 62% in 2012.

## Other Background

- After Hawaii saw the lowest voter turnout of any state in the 2012 presidential election, then Gov. Neil Abercrombie signed a law in 2014 that provided for voter registration at early voting sites beginning in 2016 and election day registration beginning in 2018.
- Electoral districts are drawn by a politically-balanced nine-member commission, with equal membership from each party and a final member chosen by the other commissioners, or, as necessary, chosen by the state Supreme Court.
- For those convicted of crimes, voting rights are automatically restored after the term of incarceration.
