FBI has opened a domestic terrorism investigation on the incidents; a third package reportedly has been found. Apparently, a note(s) inside the package complained about highway signs in Maryland that advised travelers to notify authorities about suspicious incidents (presumably the "tips" hotline or the "see something, say something" campaign). One package was addressed to Governor O'Malley, with postmark indicating that it was sent from the District. Also, according to the FBI, the device in Hanover/Lithicum had not yet been rendered safe as of about one hour ago.
