Kristina and John:

Attached are some state by state coal mining jobs # (only for states w/ > 1000 miners) between 2008 and 2013 (only 1st 6 mos. Of '13). As you can see, KY lost ~ 1/3 of its coal miners – 6k+ jobs. The other state with big losses was WV, down 5%. Without these two states, there is a net gain in coal miner jobs from these states. This info is from Bureau of Mine Safety. I don't have URL handy, but will send it. I'm not going to do anything with info, but I thought it would be useful to know, particularly when talking media/public officials from the other states.

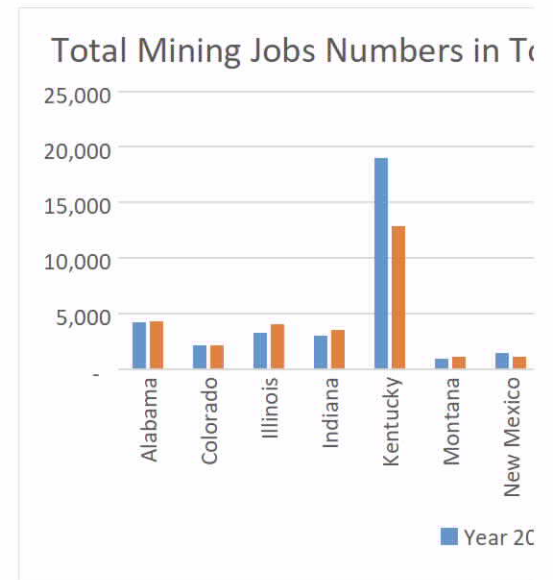

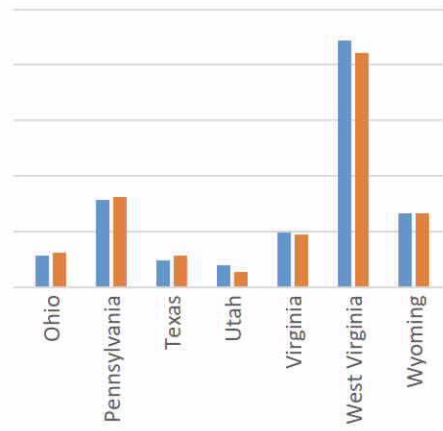
