RE: Voters want to know where Keystone XL's oil is headed, are concerned about Chinese investment, want State Department leaks to foreign interests investigated

New polling finds that 85% of Americans want Congress to ensure it knows where the oil from the Keystone XL pipeline is going. Almost as many Americans (79%) want TransCanada to testify under oath about whether the oil will stay in the country and 80% want TransCanada to have to make clear where oil from the pipeline is going before the final rejection or approval decision is made.

The findings are from polling conducted last week by SurveyUSA, an independent, non-partisan, full-service opinion research firm that conducts scientific research for media, government, and private-sector clients. SurveyUSA polled over 5,000 Americans, both nationally and in each of the following nine states: Alabama, Florida, Iowa, Louisiana, Michigan, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Ohio and South Carolina.

“Just as striking is how these findings cut across party lines. Consensus on key Pipeline policy is shared by liberals and conservatives, Republicans and Democrats, the less educated and the more educated, the less affluent and the more affluent,” according to SurveyUSA.

The findings show voters in both heavily Republican states and the competitive “battleground” states are concerned about Chinese investment in Canadian tar sands oil, as well as the effects of oil industry lobbying.

METHODOLOGY

SurveyUSA interviewed a total of 5,500 USA registered voters 02/10/14 through 02/11/14, as follows: 1,000 registered voters from a nationally representative sample and 500 registered voters from each of the following 9 states: Alabama, Michigan, Ohio, Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Louisiana, Iowa, and New Hampshire. Respondents reachable on a home telephone were interviewed on their home telephone in the recorded voice of a professional announcer. Respondents not reachable on a home telephone were shown a questionnaire on their smartphone, tablet or other electronic device.

TOP FINDINGS

Awareness of Keystone XL is high, and most have heard “[energy from a trusted ally](#)” pitch.

The polling showed a high level of awareness of the controversial project, with 72% of registered voters surveyed saying they had heard of the proposed pipeline. Of those, 81% have heard the tar sands lobby’s lobbying main talking point, that Keystone XL means “energy from a trusted ally.” However almost 30% fewer Americans (54%) think “most of the oil” will stay in the United States.

Overwhelming majorities want Congress to know where the oil will go and TransCanada to have to say it under oath.

An overwhelming majority of those surveyed (85%) say that Congress should “make sure” it knows where the Keystone XL oil will end up. This cuts across all parties (82% of Republicans, 88% of Democrats and 83% of Independents).

A large percentage of voters – 80% – say TransCanada needs to make clear where the oil is going before the decision about whether to approve the pipeline is made. And an almost equal percentage (79%) think Congress should compel testimony from Keystone XL executives about whether the oil shipped through the pipeline will be exported overseas.

Where The Oil Goes Is Key In Battleground States.

Similar to registered voters’ concerns nationally, majorities in key battleground states want Congress to know where the Keystone XL oil will go and want TransCanada to have to testify under oath. These views hold up:

- In Louisiana, Keystone XL supporter Senator Mary Landrieu is up for re-election. Among her state’s survey respondents:
 - 89% say Congress should “make sure” it knows where the Keystone XL oil will end up.
 - 84% want TransCanada executives to say where the oil shipped through Keystone XL will end up before a decision is made.
 - 80% think Congress should compel testimony from TransCanada about whether the oil will be shipped overseas.
- In North Carolina:
 - 83% say Congress should “make sure” it knows where the Keystone XL oil will end up.
 - 80% want TransCanada executives to say where the oil shipped through Keystone XL will end up before a decision is made.
 - 78% think TransCanada officials should be required by Congress to testify about whether the pipeline oil will be shipped overseas.
- In Iowa,

- 89% say Congress should “make sure” it knows where the Keystone XL oil will end up.
- 81% want TransCanada executives to say where the oil shipped through Keystone XL will end up before a decision is made.
- 79% think TransCanada officials should be required by Congress to testify about whether the pipeline oil will be shipped overseas.

Voters are suspicious of oil lobbyists and their influence on Senators.

Overwhelming majorities of Americans in every state surveyed were suspicious of oil industry lobbyists. Over 70% said Senators who “associate with oil lobbyists” are more likely to back Keystone XL. Over 60% said they would be less likely to support their Senator if they learned he or she had been successfully lobbied by a foreign-owned oil company to support Keystone XL.

- 74% of North Carolina Republican respondents said Senators who “associate with oil lobbyists” are more likely to back the Keystone XL pipeline.
- A significant percentage of Michigan and Ohio respondents (69% respectively) said they were less likely to vote for their Senators if they knew he or she had been successfully lobbied by a foreign-owned oil company.

Chinese tar sands investment concerns many voters.

A majority of voters (52%) said they had “a lot” of concern when told about the \$30 billion in tar sands investment by Chinese government-backed companies. This concern cuts across party lines – with only a one-point difference between Republicans and Democrats. Only 15% of voters were “not at all” concerned.

When informed of news accounts that Canadian interests were told in advance that they would get a favorable ruling from the State Department, a strong majority wanted the leaks investigated.

Across geographies, voters are concerned about the possibility that oil flowing through the Keystone XL Pipeline may not remain in America, and worry that foreign oil companies, some with connections to foreign governments, may have a say about where Keystone XL Pipeline oil ultimately ends up. Voters are concerned about who owns the tar sands where the oil originates, are concerned about whether a foreign or domestic entity is responsible for the maintenance of the Pipeline as it crosses American soil, and are concerned about how much of the oil stays in America once it is refined on America's Gulf Coast. Voters are impatient with Senators who may have been persuaded to vote for the Pipeline by lobbyists with foreign ties. And voters are suspect of a US State Department study which may have had a faulty premise as its underpinning. Just as striking is how these findings cut across party lines. Statement of Methodology: About the Poll: This poll was conducted by telephone in the voice of a professional announcer. Respondent households were selected at random, using Random Digit Dialed (RDD) sample provided by Survey Sampling, of Fairfield CT. All respondents heard the questions asked identically. The pollster's report includes the geography that was surveyed; the date(s) interviews were conducted, the number of respondents who answered each question and the theoretical margin of sampling error for each question. Where necessary, respondents were weighted using the most recent US Census estimates for age, gender, ethnic origin and region, to align the sample to the population. In theory, one can say with 95% certainty that the results would not vary by more than the stated margin of sampling error, in one direction or the other, had the entire universe of respondents with home telephones been interviewed with complete accuracy. There are other possible sources of error in all surveys that may be more serious than sampling error. These include: the difficulty of interviewing respondents who do not have a home telephone; the refusal by some with home telephones to be interviewed; the order in which questions are asked; the wording of questions; the way and extent to which data are weighted; and the manner in which specialized populations, such as likely voters, are determined. It is difficult to quantify the errors that may result from these and other factors.
