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Subject: Napa County Earthquake

Sir - A 6.0 Magnitude Earthquake struck Napa County, CA overnight. The epicenter was located 5 miles south of Napa, CA and 35 miles northeast of San Francisco, CA at a depth of 6.7 miles. FEMA is in contact with local first responders. Thus far there are no reports of fatalities or injuries however this magnitude usually results in severe shaking and we will likely get more substantial damage reports throughout the day. California Highway patrol is conducting damage assessments across the area and have temporarily closed Highway 37 and Interstate 80. I have asked the team to focus on any potential impact on the water supply/aqueducts given our past discussions on this topic. Thus far no reports of any impacts to critical infrastructure. There are reports of approximately 60,000 power outages and minor gas and water main disruptions. TSA reports no impact to any major airports in the region.
