Sir - Here is the latest: Rainfall has totaled more than 12 inches in 48 hours in some areas across the Colorado Front Range and in some areas of Boulder and Colorado Springs. More rainfall is expected through Sunday afternoon. FEMA confirms 4 fatalities thus far. Media are reporting over 200 unaccounted for, these numbers are being cross-referenced with shelter reports, and door to door checks are planned. Approximately 14,500 individuals have been evacuated from impacted areas, and a significant search and rescue operation is ongoing. State estimates are of 2,494 homes damaged, 2 homes destroyed. Numerous road closures and washed out roads have left several communities isolated and difficult to access.

P6/b(6) Craig Fugate has deployed multiple response teams including Mobile Emergency Response Support Assets and Mobile Communication Office Vehicles to the State. Sec. Foxx made available \$5 million in "Quick Relief" emergency funds to help Colorado quickly repair and reopen essential roads. Sec. Hagel approved a dual status commander to support response efforts and made available heavy lift helicopters to support search and rescue. An Emergency Declaration and an Expedited Major Disaster Declaration granting individual Assistance, debris removal and emergency protective measures are now in place to facilitate aggressive Federal assistance.
