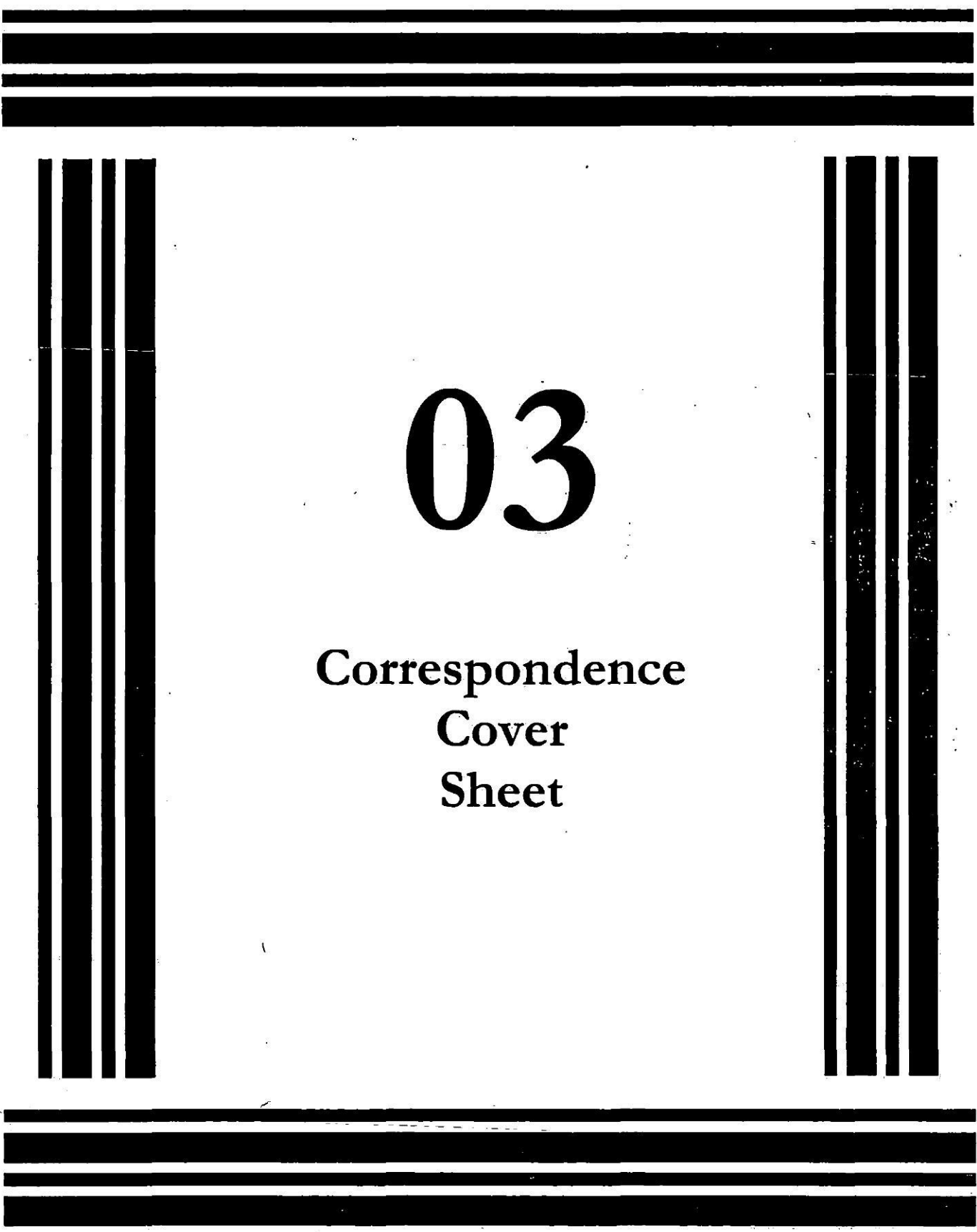

Dear President Obama:

My name is Malachi Miles; I am a senior at Chaparral High School in Las Vegas, Nevada. I am on my way to college at Arizona Western Community College in Yuma, Arizona where I expect to earn my associates degree in business, and also pursue a scholarship to play football at a university. I am writing you to share my opinion on why you should allow the first year of community college to be free for student-athletes.

As you should know, most high school athletes do not attend a university after high school or at least do not obtain a scholarship for their sport straight out of high school. Forty-four percent of low-income students (those whom family members make less than twenty-five thousand dollars per year) choose community college as their first college after high school. This is proof that most kids cannot pay to attend a university after high school, not just athletes but regular students as well. The average tuition at a two-year community college for a full time student is well over three thousand dollars. Which will put students in automatic debt because of the loans they will have to take out due to their family not filling out any FASFA information before enrolling in college. In fact, nearly seventy-five percent of graduated community college students borrowed more than five thousand dollars in student loans in 2013.

So now we have students in debt while still taking classes, the only way for them to get out of debt is to get a job. In 2013 Sixty-nine percent of community college students worked more than thirty-five hours a week in addition to taking classes. Mentally, physically and emotionally this is a heavy workload for a full time student who only wants to further their education. In fact, this may make students not want to come back and finish their second year at a community college. Studies show that students in Washington and Virginia had a quarter of students, who enrolled in the fall, but did not return for the second semester.

Remember, all these facts are from non-athletic students. So now add all the hours of school, and the hours of practice. Add the time to fit in a job to help pay for the loan that was taken out. The student athlete has to be mindful to get good grades in order to be eligible to play their sport. Then they have to manage to eat dinner, while study and read their textbook between each bite. Then some nights past midnight, choose between showering, finishing homework, or sleeping. Then they have to wake up six hours later and do all over again.

These are the many reasons why student-athletes never finish college. They are distressed emotionally and financially; this is why you should allow the first year of community college to be free for student-athletes, because student comes first.

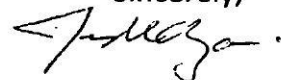
