**Remarks of President Barack Obama
Weekly Address
Saturday, June 13, 2009**

Last week, I spoke to you about my commitment to work with Congress so that we can pass health care reform this year. Today, I'd like to speak about how that effort is an essential part of our work to restore fiscal responsibility.

When it comes to the cost of health care, this much is clear: the status quo is unsustainable for families, businesses, and government. America spends nearly 50 percent more per person on health care than any other country. Health care premiums have doubled over the last decade, deductibles and out-of-pocket costs have skyrocketed, and millions with preexisting conditions are denied coverage. More and more, Americans are being priced out of the care they need.

These costs are also hurting business, as our big businesses are at a competitive disadvantage with their foreign counterparts, and small businesses are forced to cut benefits, drop coverage, or even lay off workers. Meanwhile, Medicare and Medicaid pose one of the greatest threats to our federal deficit, and could leave our children with a mountain of debt that they cannot pay.

We cannot continue down this path. I do not accept a future where Americans forego health care because they can't pay for it, and more and more families go without coverage at all. And I don't accept a future where American businesses are hurt and our government goes broke. We have a responsibility to act, and to act now. That is why I'm working with Congress to pass reform that lowers costs, improves quality and coverage, and protects consumer health care choices.

I know there are some who question whether we can afford to act this year, but the real question is whether we can afford not to act. With every passing year, health care costs consume a larger share of our nation's spending, and contribute to yawning deficits that we cannot control. So let me be clear: health reform is not part of the problem when it comes to our fiscal future, it is a fundamental part of the solution.

Real reform will mean reductions in our long term budget that help secure our children's fiscal future. And I have made a firm commitment that health reform will not add to the federal deficit over the next decade. To keep that commitment, my Administration has already identified how to pay for the historic \$635 billion down payment on reform detailed in our budget. This includes over \$300 billion that we will save through changes like reducing Medicare overpayments to private insurers, and rooting out waste in Medicare and Medicaid.

However, any honest accounting must prepare for the fact that health care reform will require additional costs in the short term in order to reduce spending in the long-term. So today, I am announcing an additional \$313 billion in savings that will rein in unnecessary spending and increase both efficiency and the quality of care – savings that will ensure that we have nearly \$950 billion set aside to offset the cost of health care reform over the next ten years.

These savings will come from commonsense changes. For example – if more Americans are insured, we can cut payments that help hospitals treat patients without health insurance. If the drug makers pay their fair share, we can cut government spending on prescription drugs. And if doctors have incentives to provide the best care instead of more care, we can help Americans avoid the unnecessary hospital stays, treatments, and tests that drive up costs. These savings underscore the fact that securing quality, affordable health care for the American people is tied directly to insisting upon fiscal responsibility. And these savings will be rooted in the same principle that must guide our broader approach to reform: we will fix what's broken, while building upon what works. If you like your plan and your doctor, you can keep them – the only changes that you'll see are lower costs and better health care.

For far too long, we have stood by while our health care system has frayed at the seams. While there has been excuse after excuse to delay reform, the price of care has gone up for individuals, for business, and for the government. This time must be different.

This is the moment when we must reform health care so that we can build a new foundation for our economy to grow; for our people to thrive; and for our country to pursue a responsible and sustainable path. Thank you.

For decades, Walter Cronkite was the most trusted voice in America. His rich baritone reached millions of living rooms every night, and in an industry of icons, Walter set the standard by which all others have been judged.

He was there through wars and riots, marches and milestones, calmly telling us what we needed to know. And through it all, he never lost the integrity he gained growing up in the heartland.

But Walter was always more than just an anchor. He was someone we could trust to guide us through the most important issues of the day; a voice of certainty in an uncertain world. He was family.

In moments of tragedy, Walter looked us in the eye and shared our pain; in moments of triumph, he rejoiced with us. He was the first to share the devastating news of John F. MEETING WITH KANSAS GOVERNOR MARK PARKINSON

I. PURPOSE

YOU are welcoming Governor Parkinson to the White House for a brief courtesy visit and introduction. Parkinson became Governor of Kansas on April 28, 2009, upon Kathleen Sebelius' confirmation as Secretary of Health and Human Services.

YOU have never met Parkinson before, and he has never been to the White House. YOU spoke to Parkinson on the phone on May 6, 2009, when you called to congratulate him on taking office.

Parkinson has indicated his strong support for YOU and the work YOU are doing on behalf of the country. He is not expected to engage in extensive policy discussion in this brief visit, but may bring up the following issues:

- Guantanamo Bay detainees: Parkinson has publicly stated his opposition to the potential relocation of Guantanamo Bay detainees to the federal prison at Fort Leavenworth. Parkinson joins Kansas Senators Pat Roberts and Sam Brownback (who is running for governor) and numerous local community leaders in expressing this opposition. Parkinson is likely to reiterate that he believes Kansas does not want detainees transferred to Leavenworth.
- State budget and economic crisis: Parkinson is expected to announce significant state budget cuts on July 1st, after having already delayed income tax refunds and funding transfers to school districts. Under Governor Sebelius, the state budget was already trimmed by nearly \$300 million, but numbers released after the budget was signed in May revealed the need for further cuts. Parkinson will try to avoid calling a special session by trimming funds across the board, including education and health care. Kansas has been allocated \$992 million in ARRA funds so far. In April, Kansas' unemployment rate was 6.4%, up from 6.1% in March, and up from 4.2% in April 2008, according to the Department of Labor.

- New Siemens facility: Governor Parkinson may invite you to attend the groundbreaking of a Siemens wind turbine facility this summer in Hutchinson. Siemens, the No. 3 turbine producer in North America, plans to break ground on the facilities this summer and expects to have 400 workers producing wind-turbine drive trains by the end of 2010. The plan was announced on May 5, 2009.
- 2010 election: Parkinson has said repeatedly he has no interest in running for Governor in 2010, though he is considered the best chance to hold the seat for Democrats. On the Republican side, Senator Sam Brownback and Kansas Secretary of State Ron Thornburgh are running for the nomination, with Brownback viewed as the likelier nominee. If Parkinson sticks to his pledge not to run for election in 2010, Kansas Democratic Party Chair Larry Gates may run for the Democratic nomination.
- Energy: Governor Sebelius fought a long running battle to prevent the construction of two new 700-megawatt coal-burning power plants by Sunflower Electric Power in southwestern Kansas; a process that lasted 2 legislative sessions and saw 5 vetoes from the Governor. Parkinson recently settled a lawsuit filed by Sunflower, which allowed for the passage of renewable energy legislation and the construction of one of the new coal plants.

Governor Parkinson was supportive of YOUR 2008 campaign and endorsed YOU one week before the February 5th caucus in Kansas.

On Thursday, June 11, Parkinson joined Vice President Biden in Overland Park, KS for the groundbreaking of a highway construction project funded by ARRA dollars. Secretary Sebelius also attended this event.

VI. BIOGRAPHY

Mark Parkinson became Kansas' 45th Governor on April 28, 2009. He had previously served as Lt. Governor since January 2007.

Parkinson was a long time Republican state legislator and former chair of the Kansas Republican Party, who switched parties in 2006 to join Kathleen Sebelius' re-election campaign as her running mate.

He was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives in 1990 and two years later was elected to the Kansas Senate, where he served until 1997. Parkinson assumed the Republican Party Chairmanship in 1999 and remained there until 2003.

After putting particular focus on wind energy as Lieutenant Governor in the last three years, wind farms have tripled in Kansas; the state is the future home to the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility; and Kansas is working to leverage resources from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act to create jobs, rebuild its infrastructure, and continue its investment in public schools.

Born in Wichita, Governor Parkinson graduated from Wichita State University in 1980 and the University of Kansas School of Law in 1984.

Parkinson and his wife Stacy have been married more than 25 years and are parents to three children: Alex, Sam, and Kit. They belong to the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood.
