PRIMARY MESSAGE OF THE DAY: Year End Press Conference

EVENT: This will give you an opportunity to recap 2013 and discuss your priorities for the upcoming year. We expect the press to ask about the budget and debt limit negotiations, the Affordable Care Act, immigration reform, the NSA, Syria, Iran, Edward Snowden and the Olympic in Russia.

COMMUNICATIONS ACTIVITIES

Unemployment Insurance

- Gene Sperling will be doing regional TV interviews to push the efforts on UI.

FLOTUS

- On Friday, the First Lady will join the President at a Holiday Reception.
- In the evening, the First Lady will depart with the First Family to Honolulu, Hawaii.

Digital Strategies

- The Office of Digital Strategies will release responses to the We the People petitions on Medicare payments for pharmacists and international travel sanctions.
- The Office of Digital Strategies will send an email from you to the White House email list encouraging people to visit HealthCare.gov, continuing our week-long push to our 4.2 million email subscribers urging them to get enrolled.

RAPID RESPONSE/RESEARCH

- We continue to conduct rapid response research on ACA implementation to support the Communications department.
- We are researching support for extending unemployment insurance.

CABINET ACTIVITIES

Activities of Note:

Affordable Care Act Implementation:

- Secretary Sebelius will travel to Houston and Dallas, TX. At both stops, she will participate in an event that will highlight the multiple ways Texans can learn about the Health Insurance Marketplace and enroll in quality, affordable health coverage under the Affordable Care Act. She will hear from residents about their experience signing up for coverage in the Marketplace and how the law has put them back in charge of their health care options. She will participate in media availability in both cities.
- Secretary Foxx will hold an open press Affordable Care Act roundtable where he will tout the benefits of the Affordable Care Act and urge the uninsured to sign up for the exchanges in Jersey City, NJ.

Transportation: Secretary Foxx will travel to New York to tour Moynihan Station and Penn Station with Sen. Schumer. While in New York, he will also meet with Mayor Bloomberg and leadership from the MTA about the recent Metro North Accident.

Screening Benefits: DHS's Transportation Security Administration, in partnership with the Department of Defense, will formally extend TSA Pre✓™ expedited screening benefits to all U.S. Armed Forces service members tomorrow. Service members, including those serving in the U.S. Coast Guard, Reserves and National Guard will be able to take advantage of an expedited screening program at more than 100 participating airports when flying on nine major U.S. airlines. DOD has worked to inform service members of the process of updating current and/or future reservations along with their airline profiles to include their identification number.

Food Production: FDA plans to issue proposed rules that would require food production facilities to identify vulnerabilities and implement mitigation strategies, along with science-based analysis, to prevent intentional adulteration of the food supply by acts of terrorism. The timing of this rule is subject to a court order. This action is likely to generate interest from Congress, consumer groups, industry, international stakeholders, media, and the public. A press release will be issued.
