This event is your annual celebration of Easter at the White House. Top Christian leaders from around the nation will gather to mark Holy Week and the Resurrection. You will offer brief remarks at the top, and an informal closing “thank you” at the program’s conclusion. The program consists of brief prayers, scripture readings, musical selections, and brief closing reflections by Bishop Vashti McKenzie.

Attendees include heads of major denominations, pastors of large congregations, and leadership from Protestant, Catholic, Orthodox, historically African American, Hispanic, LGBT and other key Christian constituency groups.

This year, the featured musical artists are Natalie Grant, a Grammy-nominated vocalist named who was selected as 2012 Female Vocalist of the Year by the Gospel Music Association, as well as the Washington Performing Arts Society’s Children of the Gospel Choir, who performed in 2009 and 2013 at the National Prayer Service.

Joel C. Hunter, Senior Pastor, Northland Church



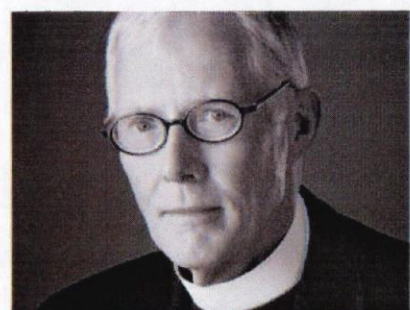
Dr. Joel Hunter is one of the most influential Christian leaders in the country. Hunter pastors Northland Church in Orlando, Florida, one of the largest churches in the state. Through an interactive webcast, Dr. Hunter is also able to reach people worldwide. A 2009-2010 member of the White House Advisory Council on Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships, a delegate to the U.S.-Islamic World Forum held in Doha, Qatar, and one of Grist magazine's top 15 religious environmental leaders in the world, Dr. Hunter seeks to build cooperation and partnerships with many different sects of human organization and has already worked with the scientific community on environmental issues and is working to build a dialogue between the Christian and Muslim communities. Hunter currently serves on the board of the World Evangelical Alliance and the National Association of Evangelicals. His wife, Becky Hunter, will be joining him.

Rev. Larry Snyder, Catholic Charities USA



In February 2005, Rev. Larry Snyder took the helm of Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA)—the national office of more than 1,700 local Catholic Charities agencies and institutions nationwide that provide help and create hope for more than 10 million people a year, regardless of their religious, social, or economic backgrounds. In 2010, Fr. Snyder published *Think and Act Anew: How Poverty in America Affects Us All and What We Can Do About It*. The book describes the near economic collapse of the American economy and its effects on people, providing the United States with an opportunity to think and act anew in dealing with the thousands-of-years-old problem of entrenched poverty. The faces of the poor are described through stories of those who have sought Catholic Charities services. In 2011 Father Snyder was honored with a Doctor Of Humane Letters degree from St. Francis University in Loretto, Pennsylvania. He currently sits on the board of the Independent Sector. He is also a trustee of the America's Promise Alliance and is a weekend associate at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish in Arlington, Virginia.

Rev. Gary R. Hall, Washington National Cathedral



The Very Rev. Gary R. Hall assumed his duties as the tenth dean of Washington National Cathedral on October 1, 2012. Hall has been an ordained minister for more than 35 years and most recently served as rector of Christ Church Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills, Mich. Prior to his post in Michigan, Hall served as dean and president of Seabury-Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., from 2005 to 2010. Before that he served as rector of the Church of the

Redeemer in Bryn Mawr, Penn., from 2000 to 2005. And for 11 years prior, he served as the senior associate for education at All Saints Episcopal Church in Pasadena, Calif., one of the largest and most influential parishes on the west coast. Hall was born September 22, 1949, in Los Angeles, Calif. He earned an A.B. in English at the University of California, Berkeley, in 1972, before enrolling at the Episcopal Divinity School at Cambridge, Mass. He earned his M.Div. degree in 1976 with distinction and started his career as a deacon intern and Bishop's Chaplain in Los Angeles. He later earned a master's degree in English from the University of California, Los Angeles, in 1984. He added a C.Phil. (Candidate of Philosophy) credential in 1987 and a Ph.D. in English in 1989, both from UCLA.

Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie, African Methodist Episcopal Church



Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie serves as the 117th elected and consecrated bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Her historic election in the year 2000 represents the first time in the over 200 year history of the A.M.E. Church that a woman had obtained the level of Episcopal office. Currently, she is honored to serve as the presiding prelate of the 13th Episcopal District, which includes Tennessee and Kentucky. Bishop McKenzie has been appointed by President Barack Obama to serve on the President's Advisory Council of the White House Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships. She is also a member of the Board of Trustees of Payne Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio and the International Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia.

Pastors Gabriel and Jeanette Salguero, Lamb's Church

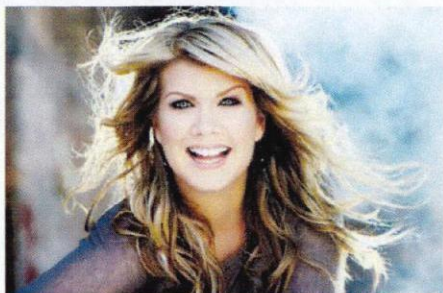

For over a decade, the choir has performed with an array of special guests, including Kiri Te Kanawa, Step Afrika!, Kathleen Battle, Yolanda Adams and Vickie Winans. PARTICIPANT BIOGRAPHIES

Dr. Carroll Baltimore, *President, Progressive National Baptist Convention*

In addition to being President of Progressive National Baptist Convention, Dr. Baltimore is also the Senior Pastor of the International Community Baptist Churches in the United States and the Philippines. He has helped establish over 30 churches and educated Pastors in Africa, the Philippines, India, South Korea and Jamaica. His radio broadcasts, outreach ministries, and sermons have been heard on six continents and in 135 countries.

Bishop Edwin Bass, *President, Church of God in Christ*

Pastor Bass is the government affairs liaison for the Church of God in Christ, and the founder and senior pastor of The Empowered Church COGIC. The Empowered Church's mission is to add virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, and kindness to their faith. Bishop Bass serves on the board of Weed & Seed, an initiative by the U.S. Department of Justice to reduce urban violence

Bishop George E. Battle Jr., *Presiding Bishop, African Methodist Zion Church*

Elected in 1992, Bishop Battle presently serves the Piedmont Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church which includes the New York, New England, Western New York, and the Bahama Islands Conferences. He is one of the founders of the Urban League of Central Carolinas, an organization created to empower the community to attain financial stability and social justice through education and training.

Rev. Amos Brown, *Pastor, Third Baptist Church*

Dr. Brown has been Pastor of San Francisco's Third Baptist Church since 1976. Before Third Baptist, Rev. Brown served as Pastor of Saint Paul's Baptist Church in West Chester, Pennsylvania and Pilgrim Baptist Church in St. Paul, Minnesota. He was one of eight students in the only class Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. taught at Morehouse College.

Rev. Miniard Culpepper, *Pastor, Pleasant Hill Baptist Church*

Rev. Culpepper was called into the ministry in 1986 and entered Howard University School of Divinity where he graduated with a Master of Divinity degree. He served as Associate Minister at the historic Metropolitan Baptist Church in Washington, D.C. for seven years.

In June 2004 he was appointed as the Acting Regional Director for the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Rev. Joseph Darby, *Senior Pastor, Morris Brown African Methodist Episcopal Church*

A fourth generation minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, Rev. Darby is currently pastor of Morris Brown AME Church located in Charleston, South Carolina. This ministry is the largest congregation in the Seventh Episcopal District of the AME Church. Rep. James Clyburn attends his church.

Bishop Orlando Findlayter, *Chair, Churches United to Save and Heal*

Bishop Findlayter has served as the Chair of Churches United to Save and Heal (CUSH) since 2005. CUSH is an umbrella organization of African and Caribbean churches across the United States that focus on advocacy efforts to secure immigration reform. He recently participated in the immigration roundtable you hosted with faith leaders in the Roosevelt Rooms.

Rev. Debra Haggins, *University Chaplain, Hampton University*

Rev. Debra L. Haggins is the first female Executive Secretary of the Hampton University Ministers' Conference and the first female Chaplain of Hampton University. She is a member of First Baptist Church Denbigh located in Newport News, Virginia. She also organizes the Annual Hampton Ministers' Conference held each June.

Rev. Cynthia Hale, *Senior Pastor, Ray of Hope Christian Church*

Rev. Dr. Cynthia L. Hale is the founding and Senior Pastor of the Ray of Hope Christian Church in Decatur, Georgia. The Church works to evoke positive changes in healthcare, education, and housing. In 2004, Dr. Hale established a mentoring program known as Elah Pastoral Ministries, Inc. to assist in the spiritual as well as practical development of pastors and para-church leaders. In July 2009, Dr. Hale was appointed by you to serve on the President's Commission on White House Fellowships.

Rev. Derrick Harkins, *Nineteenth Street Baptist Church*

Rev. Harkins is the Senior Pastor at the Historic Nineteenth Street Baptist Church. He has been serving as pastor since November 1997 and before then he was the Senior Minister of the New Hope Baptist Church of Dallas, Texas. In 2011, at the request of the White House, Dr. Harkins began serving as the National Director of Faith Outreach for the DNC. He is a member of Christians for Comprehensive Immigration Reform, was a contributing author for *The Audacity of Faith: Christian Leaders Reflect on the Election of Barack Obama*, and is a writer for the Sojourner's blog.

Dr. Freddie Haynes, *Senior Pastor, Friendship-West Baptist Church*

Dr. Frederick D. Haynes, III is the Senior Pastor of the Friendship-West Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas. During his time as Pastor, Friendship-West has grown to nearly 12,000 members. Dr. Haynes serves as Chair of the Samuel Dewitt Proctor Conference, and is on the Board of Directors for the National Action Network and the Conference of National Black Churches. Dr. Haynes has also served as a committee member for the MLK Memorial Foundation, leading to the erection of the first African American Monument on the Washington D.C. Mall.

Pastor Charles Jenkins, *Senior Pastor, Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church*

The Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church is a rapidly growing multi-location congregation of over 8,000 members in the Chicago area. He is a Grammy award-winning songwriter and author. Under his leadership, Fellowship has profoundly impacted the city by providing food, clothing, personal care items and critical assistance to tens of thousands of people in need through several of Fellowship's outreach programs. Jenkins also created the Fellowship Educational and Economic Development Corporation to further focus on community improvement and empowerment.

Rev. John L. McCullough, *President and CEO, Church World Service*

Church World Service is an international humanitarian agency providing emergency relief, advocacy, sustainable development, and refugee assistance in more than 80 countries. In January 2003, Rev. McCullough served as a member of a high level humanitarian research mission to Iraq sponsored by the Center for Social and Economic Rights. In July 2002, he led an ecumenical

peacemaking delegation to four countries in West Africa, and in March of 2003 he hosted a return delegation of West African church and grassroots leaders to meet and advocate with United Nations, U.S. government officials, and U.S. ecumenical groups, urging international attention to the escalating crisis in Liberia.

Bishop Vashti McKenzie, *African Methodist Episcopal Church*

Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie is the presiding prelate of the Thirteenth Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. In 2000, she became the first woman in the 200-year history of A.M.E. to obtain the title of bishop. In 2004, she was the first woman to become the Titular Head of the denomination, as the president of the Council of Bishops.

Rev. Al Sharpton, *President, National Action Network, New York, NY*

Rev. Sharpton is a notable civil rights activist, and television/radio talk show host. In 2004, he was a candidate for the Democratic nomination for the U.S. presidential election. He hosts his own radio talk show, "Keepin' It Real," and makes regular guest appearances on Fox News, CNN, and MSNBC. He has recently been named the host of MSNBC's PoliticsNation, a nightly talk show which premiered in August 2011.

Bishop Walter Thomas, *Senior Pastor, New Psalmist Baptist Church*

Bishop Walter Scott Thomas has served as the pastor of the New Psalmist Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland since 1975. Under his leadership, the church body has grown from 200 to more than 7,000 active members. In July 2005, Bishop Thomas was elevated to the office of Bishop and Presiding Prelate of The Kingdom Association of Covenant Pastors. In addition to providing pastoral leadership to the New Psalmist Baptist Church, Bishop Thomas served as the past president of the Hampton University Minister's Conference from 1999 until 2002.

Rev. Stephen Thurston, *President, National Baptist Convention of America*

Rev. Thurston was elected President of National Baptist Convention of America in 2003, after serving as Vice President since 1989. He has been the pastor of the New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church since 1979. He is also a Board Member of the NBCA, Inc. Foreign Mission Board and a Board Member and Revivalist for the NBCA, Inc. Evangelical Board. In January 2005, he, along with the other Presidents gave leadership to the 1st Joint Winter Board Meeting of the National Baptist Conventions.

Rev. Albert Tyson, *St. Stephen A.M.E. Church*

Rev. Tyson is the Presiding Elder at St. Stephen A.M.E. Church in Chicago, IL. In 2007, Rev. Tyler signed on as part of the African American Religious Leadership Conference to support then-Senator Obama.

Bishop Edgar Vann, *Senior Pastor, Second Ebenezer Church*

Bishop Vann has been Pastor of Second Ebenezer Church in Detroit, MI since 1976. During his tenure, membership has grown from 66 to more than 5,000. In 1994, he founded the Vanguard Community Development Corporation, a holistic community service and development organization that works to ignite educational, economic, and community-based development. He is a featured columnist on faith and policy for the *Detroit News* and has been given the distinction of being one of Metro Detroit's most influential ministers by the *Detroit Free Press*.
