EVENT: Remarks in the East Room on the BRAIN Initiative

You will deliver remarks in the East Room announcing the BRAIN (Brain Research through Advancing Innovative Neurotechnologies) Initiative, an effort designed to revolutionize our understanding of the human brain. The event is open press.

COMMUNICATIONS ACTIVITIES

Innovation

- The Office of Digital Strategy is working closely with OSTP and NIH to amplify your BRAIN Initiative. Following your announcement, we will release a video of NIH Director Dr. Collins explaining the science and the overall initiative. We will also publish a blog post and infographic on WH.gov that help people understand the potential of this initiative, in terms of science, understanding the human brain and in creating jobs of the future.
- The White House Office of Digital Strategy will host an Open for Questions live stream with DARPA Director Dr. Arati Prabhakar and NIH Director Francis S. Collins to amplify your brain mapping initiative.
- Communications will work with OSTP to make sure validators are on cable news shows to highlight your brain mapping initiative.

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong's Visit

- In the afternoon, you will participate in a bilateral meeting with Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong of Singapore.
- Later, the Vice President will also meet with Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong.

Vital Voices Global Leadership Awards Benefit

- In the evening, the Vice President will deliver remarks at the Vital Voices Global Leadership Awards Benefit at the Kennedy Center. His remarks will be open press.

Life and Legacy of Jackie Robinson

- The First Lady will host a screening of the “42” movie for students of several schools and the Jackie Robinson Foundation. A related workshop will follow with the First Lady discussing the inspiring life and legacy of Jackie Robinson. This event will be closed press.

2013 Easter Egg Roll

- The First Lady’s Easter Egg Roll interview with Entertainment Tonight will air.

Women’s Entrepreneurship

- Valerie Jarrett will appear on MSNBC *Morning Joe* in a panel to discuss women’s entrepreneurship.

RAPID RESPONSE/RESEARCH

- We continue to closely track and compile reporting on local impacts of the sequester.
- We are researching prior support for your gun policy proposals to assist the communications department.
- We are researching budget and sequester-related issues to assist the communications department.

CABINET ACTIVITIES

Activities of Note:

- **Immigration:** Secretary Sebelius will participate in a closed-press listening session with community leaders on common sense immigration reform. The event will be held at the University of Miami.
- **Gun Violence:** Secretary Napolitano will travel to Drexel University in Philadelphia to announce the selectees of the Campus Resilience Pilot program that provides institutions of higher education the opportunity to be part of a pilot emergency preparedness and resilience planning program, which includes anti-gun violence efforts. She'll also meet with Philadelphia Police Chief Chuck Ramsey on reducing gun violence.
- **ACA Implementation:** Director Kerlikowske will provide remarks at Operation UNITE’s National Prescription Drug Abuse Summit in Orlando. His keynote remarks will address progress on the *Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention Plan*, overdose prevention, and the ACA’s role in delivering treatment.
- **DoD:** Secretary Hagel and Deputy Secretary Carter will meet with Secretary of Foreign Affairs Del Rosario of the Philippines.
- **DOI:** Secretary Salazar will be in Dayton, OH at an event to celebrate the dedication of the Colonel Young National Monument.
- **State:** Secretary Kerry will hold bilateral meetings with Philippines Foreign Secretary Albert del Rosario, and separately, with Republic of Korea Foreign Minister Yun Byung-se.

- **DOT:** Secretary LaHood will speak at the Bradley University Executive Summit. The Secretary will amplify your State of the Union message by highlighting how transportation investments have created jobs and promoted economic development.
- **VA:** Secretary Shinseki will meet with Jeff Immelt. They will discuss GE Healthcare initiatives, GE's Veterans Network, and potential VA participation in the GE and National Football League traumatic brain injury initiative.

I. PURPOSE

YOU will provide remarks about the importance of investing in research and science and announce the BRAIN (Brain Research through Advancing Innovative Neurotechnologies) Initiative. YOU will give remarks before an audience of approximately 200 private-sector, philanthropic, and academic leaders in the fields of medicine, neuroscience, and nanoscience. Dr. Francis Collins, Director of the National Institutes of Health, one of the leaders in this initiative, will introduce YOU.

This initiative follows from the vision YOU laid out in YOUR State of the Union address for creating jobs and building a growing, thriving middle class by making a historic investment in research and development. The Initiative includes:

Key investments to jumpstart the effort: The National Institutes of Health, the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency, and the National Science Foundation will support approximately \$100 million in research beginning in FY 2014.

Strong academic leadership: The National Institutes of Health will establish a high-level working group co-chaired by Dr. Cornelia “Cori” Bargmann (The Rockefeller University) and Dr. William Newsome (Stanford University) to define detailed scientific goals for the NIH’s investment, and to develop a multi-year scientific plan for achieving these goals, including timetables, milestones, and cost estimates.

Public-private partnerships: Federal research agencies will partner with companies, foundations, and private research institutions that are also investing in relevant neuroscience research, such as the Allen Institute, the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, the Kavli Foundation, and the Salk Institute for Biological Studies.

Maintaining our highest ethical standards: All pioneering research has the potential to raise new ethical challenges. To ensure this new effort proceeds in ways that continue to adhere to our highest standards of research protections, YOU will direct YOUR Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues to explore the ethical,

legal, and societal implications raised by this research initiative and other recent advances in neuroscience.

This initiative is one of YOUR Administration's "Grand Challenges" – ambitious but achievable goals that require advances in science and technology. In YOUR remarks, YOU will call on companies, research universities, foundations, and philanthropists to join with you in identifying and pursuing the Grand Challenges of the 21st century.

BACKGROUND ON BRAIN INITIATIVE ANNOUNCEMENT

The BRAIN Initiative will accelerate the development and application of new technologies that will enable researchers to produce dynamic pictures of the brain that show how individual brain cells and complex neural circuits interact at the speed of thought. These technologies will open new doors to explore how the brain records, processes, uses, stores, and retrieves vast quantities of information, and shed light on the complex links between brain function and behavior.

In the last decade alone, scientists have made a number of landmark discoveries that now create the opportunity to unlock the mysteries of the brain, including the sequencing of the human genome, the development of new tools for mapping neuronal connections, the increasing resolution of imaging technologies, and the explosion of nanoscience. These breakthroughs have paved the way for unprecedented collaboration and discovery across scientific fields. For instance, by combining advanced genetic and optical techniques, scientists can now use pulses of light to determine how specific cell activities in the brain affect behavior. In addition, through the integration of neuroscience and physics, researchers can now use high-resolution imaging technologies to observe how the brain is structurally and functionally connected in living humans.

While these technological innovations have contributed substantially to our expanding knowledge of the brain, significant breakthroughs in how we treat neurological and psychiatric disease will require a new generation of tools to enable researchers to record signals from brain cells in much greater numbers and at even faster speeds. This cannot currently be achieved, but great promise for developing such technologies lies at the intersections of nanoscience, imaging, engineering, informatics, and other rapidly emerging fields of science and engineering.

Representative Fattah serves the 2nd Congressional District of Pennsylvania, which is comprised of portions of urban Philadelphia, including Northwest and West Philadelphia, as well as Ardmore and Bala Cynwyd. He was elected in 1994 and is a member of the Appropriations Committee, where he is the Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies. He is also a member of the Congressional Black Caucus and the Congressional Progressive Caucus. Prior to serving in the House, he was a member of the Pennsylvania Senate from 1989 to 1994 and the Pennsylvania House of Representatives from 1983 to 1988.

- Representative Fattah authored appropriations language directing the Office of Science and Technology Policy to run a multi-agency neuroscience initiative.
- During this session of Congress, Representative Fattah has introduced multiple bills relating to education and global competitiveness, including:
 - Student Bill of Rights – Directs the Secretary of Education to make annual determinations as to whether each state's public school system provides all its students with the educational resources to succeed academically and in life.
 - Reinvesting and Ensuring America's Ability to Lead Act of 2013 – Directs the Congressional Budget Office to devise criteria to evaluate American global competitiveness.
 - American Discoveries and American Jobs Commission Act of 2013 – Establishes the Commission on American Discoveries and American Jobs to study and recommend improvements to the Federal funding of research.
- He also introduced a resolution expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that it is imperative that the United States creates a clear vision and goal to be the world leader in innovation, science, technology, engineering, and math to ensure the continued strength, growth, and vitality of this Nation. During the 112th Congress, he introduced the same resolution.

BIOGRAPHIES OF KEY PARTICIPANTS

Rachel Robinson, widow of Jackie Robinson

Rachel Robinson, age 90, is the widow of Jackie Robinson. She met Jackie Robinson in 1941 and they married in 1946. They were married for 27 years until Jackie Robinson passed away in 1973. After his passing, Mrs. Robinson founded the Jackie Robinson Foundation, a non-profit organization which gives scholarships to minority youths for higher education. Mrs. Robinson continues to serve on the Board of Directors for the foundation.



After Jackie Robinson's retirement from baseball, Mrs. Robinson pursued her nursing career, eventually becoming an Assistant Professor at Yale School of Nursing and later, the Director of Nursing at the Connecticut Mental Health Center. She has two children, Sharon (age 63), and David (age 60).

Sharon Robinson, daughter of Jackie Robinson

Sharon Robinson is the author of many works of fiction and nonfiction. She has written several widely praised books about her father. In addition to her writing career, Ms. Robinson is an educational consultant for Major League Baseball. In this capacity, she oversees school and community-based educational program. 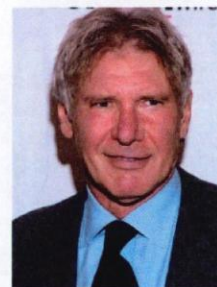
Chadwick Boseman, actor, plays Jackie Robinson

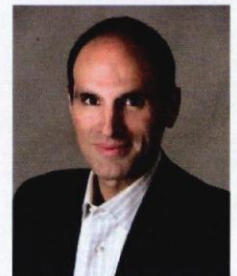
Thomas Tull, producer
