PRIMARY MESSAGE OF THE DAY: Gun Safety

EVENT: Roundtable and Remarks at the Denver Police Academy

You will travel to the Denver Police Academy in Denver, Colorado, to participate in a roundtable and deliver remarks continuing your call to the American people to join you in urging Congress to pass common-sense measures to reduce gun violence. The roundtable is pooled press and remarks are open press.

COMMUNICATIONS ACTIVITIES

Gun Safety

- Attorney General Holder will join you in Colorado to meet with local law enforcement officials and community leaders to discuss the new measures the state recently put in place, including closing loopholes in the background check system to keep guns out of the hands criminals and others who should not have access to them.
- White House officials will appear on cable news shows to preview your remarks from Denver, CO.
- WhiteHouse.gov and White House social media properties will amplify your remarks on gun safety in Denver, Colorado and share graphics on social media to explain the background check system and its popularity among Americans.

Innovation

- NIH Director Francis Collins will be on Comedy Central *Colbert Report* to highlight the BRAIN initiative.
- Today, NIH Director Francis Collins appeared in packages on CNN *Situation Room*, CBS *Evening News*, and the Washington Post's online news show *The Fold* to tout your BRAIN initiative.

Kids' State Dinner

- The First Lady's communications team will launch the contest for the second annual Kids' State Dinner. This is a contest where kids across the country submit healthy lunchtime recipes and one winner from each state comes to the White House for a Kids' State Dinner. This event is sponsored by Epicurious.
- The Office of Digital Strategy is working with OFL, *Let's Move!*, Epicurious, the Department of Education and USDA to announce the Second Annual Healthy Lunchtime Challenge — winners will be invited to the White House to attend a Kids' State Dinner this summer.

RAPID RESPONSE/RESEARCH

- We are researching issues around gun violence prevention to assist the communications department.
- We continue to monitor and compile reporting on agency and local impacts of the sequester.
- We are researching governors' and other officials' statements on the effects of the sequester to assist the communications department.

CABINET ACTIVITIES

Activities of Note:

- **Minimum Wage:** Acting Secretary Harris will host a roundtable with low-wage workers in Charlotte, NC, to amplify the Administration's proposal to raise the minimum wage.
- **Early Learning:** Secretary Duncan will travel to Knoxville, Tennessee, where he will participate in a school visit with Gov. Haslam, deliver remarks about your proposals to expand early learning opportunities for all children, as well as engage in a discussion with teachers about the challenges and opportunities of education reform.
- **Trade financing:** SBA, in conjunction with other trade agencies such as U.S. Export-Import Bank and Commerce Department, will launch Global Business Solutions Pilot program at SBA's Office of International Trade's Annual Lender's Roundtable in D.C. The pilot aims to "one-stop-shop" solution to trade financing.
- **USDA:** Secretary Vilsack will host a roundtable meeting with leaders from major anti-hunger organizations to discuss strategies for increasing awareness and participation in the Summer Food Service Program among eligible low-income families in Washington, D.C.
- **DOC:** Commerce plans to release the Assess Costs Everywhere (ACE) Tool, which provides businesses a smart way to make decisions about where to source or manufacture their goods.
- **DoD:** Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel will deliver remarks at the National Defense University on the defense strategy. His remarks will be open press.
- **DOI:** The Agency will issue a press release that provides an update on the progress of the National Water Census, which is being developed at the USGS to help the nation address its critical water needs. The report is being submitted to Congress as part of the SECURE Water Act.
- **NASA:** Administrator Bolden will travel to Philadelphia, PA, where he will visit Overbrook High School in Philadelphia with Congressman Chaka Fattah, and then speak to the West Point Society of Philadelphia.
- **Treasury:** Secretary Lew will meet with Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong of Singapore at Blair House. There may be a photo spray at the top of the meeting.
- **VA:** Secretary Shinseki will host the monthly breakfast at VACO in Washington, DC, for the Big "6" VSOs.

A. Background on participants and Buckley Air Force Base

BACKGROUND

Colonel Dan Dant, 460th Space Wing Commander

Col. Dant is Commander of the 460th Space Wing. He entered the Air Force in 1990 as a distinguished graduate of the East Carolina University ROTC program. After a tour as an ICBM instructor and evaluator, he served in the prestigious Air Force Intern Program at the Pentagon, and also completed the rigorous USAF Weapons School. Prior to his current assignment, Colonel Dant was a Chief of Staff of the Air Force Fellow detailed as the Director of Space Policy for the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Space Policy.

CMSgt Bill Ward, 460th Space Wing Command Chief

Chief Master Sergeant Ward is the Command Chief Master Sergeant for 460th Space Wing, and serves as the principal senior enlisted advisor to the commander on matters influencing the health, morale, training, readiness, quality of life and effective utilization of 1,800 personnel. Chief Ward entered the Air Force in October 1989 and has held various leadership positions at all levels of the Security Forces career field. Chief Ward has extensive experience supporting operations in Iraq and Afghanistan. He is a Distinguished Graduate of the Noncommissioned Officers Academy and Senior Noncommissioned Officers Academy.

Buckley Air Force Base

Buckley Air Force Base is an Air Force Space Command base that serves active duty, National Guard, Reserve and retired personnel throughout the Front Range community. Buckley AFB conducts air operations and provides space-based missile warning capabilities and space surveillance operations and communications. Buckley AFB includes 3,100 active duty members from every service, 4,000 National Guard personnel and Reservists, four commonwealth international partners, 2,400 civilians, and 2,500 contractors. Buckley AFB plays a significant role in Operation NOBLE EAGLE which provides for the 24-hour defense of the land, sea and air of the continental United States.

In current Air Force planning, Buckley will continue to retain all 23 of its Air National Guard F-16 C/D aircraft, and the Air National Guard will lose approximately 30 billets but retain close to 1,370 personnel on base.

GREET PARTICIPANTS

Elected Officials

Mark Ferrandino, Speaker of the Colorado House of Representatives (D)

Ferrandino was elected State Representative for the 2nd District in 2007, and has served as House Speaker since 2012. Previously, he was a senior budget analyst at the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing and a Program Analyst with the US Department of Justice. He lives with his partner Greg.

Christopher Herndon, Denver City Council President Pro Tem (D)

Herndon was elected to Denver City Council in 2011 and represents the district where the Police Academy is located. Prior to this, he held managerial positions at United Airlines and Walmart. A West Point graduate and Iraq War veteran, Herndon served for nearly seven years in the United States Army. In 2011, he issued a public statement applauding YOU for ending the war in Iraq. His statement was featured on the White House Intergovernmental Affairs website.

Beth McCann, Colorado State Representative (D)

McCann was elected State Representative for the 8th District in 2008. Denver Police Academy is located in her district. McCann was a lead sponsor of recently signed legislation to enact universal background checks for gun purchases. She previously served as Deputy Attorney General. McCann and her husband, Christopher, have two children.

John Morse, President of the Colorado Senate (D)

Morse was elected State Senator for the 11th District in 2006, and has served as Senate President since 2009. Previously, he was a Certified Public Accountant at Deloitte Haskins and Sells and served as police chief for the City of Fountain.

Mary Beth Susman, Denver City Council President (D)

Susman was elected to Denver City Council in 2011. She was elected by her peers to serve as Council President in 2012, and is the owner of MB Susman, LLC, a technology consulting firm. She previously served as the Vice President of the Colorado Community College System and President of Colorado Community College Online. She also created statewide online colleges for Kentucky and Louisiana.

Community Leaders

Laura Fronckiewicz, Chapter Leader, Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America

Fronckiewicz leads local activists affiliated with Moms Demand Action (MDA), a new grassroots association of mothers in the wake of the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting. MDA has actively worked to raise the voice of mothers to press for universal background checks and an assault weapons ban on the state and federal level through social media and local action.

Caroll & Sean Duran, Director of Curriculum, Sims Fayola International Academy

Caroll has been a teacher for the entirety of her professional career and currently serves as the Director of Curriculum at Sims Fayola International Academy. She and her 11 year old son, Sean, distinguished themselves during the 2012 campaign by frequently canvassing high density Latino and African American neighborhoods to register voters.

Gregory Grote, Educator

Greg has been an elementary educator since 1988 teaching in the classroom for over 20 years and serving as a principal for one year. Greg has served as the president of the Poudre Education Association, representing nearly 1,100 licensed staff, for the past 4 years. He also serves as a member of the NEA Board of Directors and is on the Executive Committee for the Colorado Education Association.

Sandra Gutierrez, President & CEO, Pueblo Latino Chamber of Commerce

Gutierrez is the President and CEO of the Pueblo Latino Chamber of Commerce Pueblo. She formerly served in former Governor Bill Ritter's Jobs Cabinet and was an appointee on the Colorado Small Business Council. Gutierrez served as a surrogate and validator for your campaign in both the Latino and business communities throughout the 2012 cycle.

Eileen McCarron, President, Colorado Ceasefire Capitol Fund

McCarron is the President and co-founder of the Colorado Ceasefire Capitol Fund. This political committee was formed in 2000 after the Colorado State legislature failed to enact meaningful gun reforms. The organization works with a lobbyist at the Colorado Legislature, and also does grassroots advocacy on gun violence issues in Washington, DC and Colorado. Unlike many gun violence advocates, McCarron is not a victim of gun violence but she has been active on the issue since the early 1990's. She worked with Texans Against Gun Violence in the mid-1990s and later with post-Columbine gun safety advocates in Colorado. She also has been engaged in advocacy efforts following the Aurora theatre shooting. McCarron has worked as a computer programmer, a geophysicist and a high school teacher. She currently works part-time as a community college teacher in Aurora, Colorado.

Steven Olson, Denver National Security Branch Acting Special Agent in Charge, FBI

Olson is the Acting Special Agent in Charge of the Denver FBI's National Security Branch where he manages the branch's terrorism, cybercrimes, counterintelligence and Weapons of Mass Destruction programs. A 23 year veteran of the FBI, Olson previously was assigned as a Supervisory Special Agent with the Domestic Terrorism Operations Unit at FBI headquarters and as supervisor of the Denver Division's Domestic Terrorism and Intelligence Squads. Olson's international assignments include responding to the U.S. Embassy bombings in East Africa and two rotations in Iraq. Olson holds a B.A. from Brigham Young University and a M.A. from the University of Denver.

Tami Parker, Former Deputy Field Director, OFA-Colorado

Parker has worked for you for nearly the last five years continuously. Most recently, she served as the Deputy Field Director for Colorado in 2012 but she also previously held similar field positions during the first presidential campaign and for Organizing for America during the 2010 midterm cycle.

Federico Peña – Senior Advisor, Vestar Capital Partners

Peña is a senior advisor at Vestar Capital Partners, an investment firm he joined in 1998. He served two terms as the mayor of Denver in the 1980s and early 1990s and was the Secretary of Transportation under President Bill Clinton.

Shayla Sanders, Student

Sanders is in her junior year as a Public Policy and Political Science major student at the University of Denver. She testified in support of House Bill 13-1226 "No Concealed Carry At Colleges" because she believes that every college student should feel safe on campus and is a strong supporter of gun control. As a minority, and a single mother of her six month-old son, Kameran, she believes in working for change in the Black community. She is also an intern for New Era Colorado, a non-partisan, non-profit organization that works specifically to engage the rising American electorate in the democratic process.

Pat Stryker – Founder, Bohemian Foundation

Stryker is the granddaughter of Homer Stryker, surgeon and founder of Stryker Corporation, a medical technology company. She is the founder of the Bohemian Foundation, which participates in community initiatives by awarding grants for local organizations to achieve their goals. Stryker – who is unmarried and has three children – has been a generous supporter of your campaigns for a long time. You last saw her at the White House in June of 2012.

Andrew Traver, Denver Field Division Special Agent in Charge, ATF

Traver is the Special Agent in Charge of the ATF's Denver Field Division where he manages the bureau's criminal and regulatory responsibilities in Colorado, Montana, Utah and Wyoming. A 26 year veteran of the ATF, YOU nominated him to become Director in 2010 and 2011, the first ATF career Special Agent to be nominated. The Senate returned his nomination without taking action in December 2012 – you nominated Todd Jones as Director in February. Prior to his tenure in Denver, Traver spent eight years as the Special Agent in Charge of the Chicago field office and has held leadership positions with the ATF in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New Orleans and San Francisco. A former Naval officer, Traver holds a B.A. from Northern Illinois University.

Tina Walls, Retired

Tina is a recently retired corporate marketing executive. She has served on a variety of boards, including the National Conference on State Legislatures Foundation, the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation and the Milwaukee Art Museum. Tina is constantly traveling the world and enjoying her retirement. Tina is also an active member of the Ricketson Theatre in the Denver Center for the Performing Arts. Within this role she is currently creating inner city youth program for the arts.

John Walsh, US Attorney, District of Colorado

John Walsh is the United States Attorney for Colorado. YOU nominated him in 2010, and in 2011, Walsh was named by Attorney General Holder to the Attorney General's Advisory Committee and the Attorney General's Residential Mortgage Backed Securities Fraud Working Group. Previously, Walsh served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Las Angeles and as Chief of the Major Frauds Section of the U.S. Attorney's Office. Prior to his nomination as U.S. Attorney,

Walsh worked in private practice at Holland & Hart and later, Hill & Robbins. Walsh graduated with honors from Stanford Law School, where he was Senior Notes Editor of the Law Review.

Denise Washington, Executive Director, Colorado Coalition Against Domestic Violence

At the Colorado Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Washington advocates for community-based domestic violence programs across the state and the survivors they serve. In addition to raising awareness for domestic violence issues, she also partners with government agencies and other organizations to advance policy for domestic violence survivors. She has worked on domestic violence issues since in the early 1990s, and since has run a child abuse prevention program and another program helping women to escape prostitution. Washington also has led the Oregon Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

Dr. Albert Yates – Director, Guaranty Bancorp

Yates is the director of Guaranty Bancorp, a bank holding company that operates 34 branches in Colorado. Originally from Memphis, TN he served in the U.S. Navy aboard the U.S.S. Kitty Hawk and is the former President of Colorado State University in Fort Collins. Yates along with Pat Stryker and other prominent members of the progressive community in Colorado regularly collaborate on causes of importance to them including your campaigns.
