

Sara Bareilles first achieved mainstream critical praise in 2007 with the internationally successful hit, "Love Song" from her debut album Little Voice. Since then, the Eureka, California, native has gone on to receive five GRAMMY® nominations including Song of the Year and Best Female Pop Vocal Performance for "Love Song." Bareilles' highly anticipated platinum sophomore release, Kaleidoscope Heart, debuted in September of 2010 at number one on the Billboard top 200 chart. The album yielded the hit single "King of Anything," which earned a GRAMMY® nomination for Best Female Pop Vocal Performance. In 2012, she released Once Upon Another Time EP, which was produced by singer-songwriter Ben Folds. Sara's acclaimed third studio album, The Blessed Unrest, was released in 2013 via Epic Records and debuted at number two on the Billboard album chart. She was nominated for two GRAMMY® Awards including Album of the Year and Best Pop Performance for her hit single "Brave." Sara's New York Times bestselling book, Sounds Like Me: My Life (So Far) In Song, was released in the fall of 2015. What's Inside: Songs from Waitress, her latest studio album, is out now featuring songs from the upcoming Broadway musical Waitress, which opens this April.

Thurston, and director, Michele Fowlin, the Children of the Gospel Choir has performed at various prestigious venues including the Washington Performing Arts' main stage, The White House, the National Cathedral, the U.S. State Department, and the Kennedy Center.
