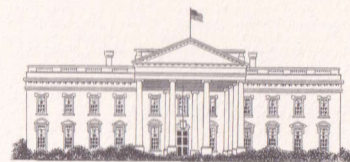

**SARA BAREILLES**

Sara Bareilles first achieved mainstream critical praise in 2007 with the internationally successful hit, "Love Song" from her debut album *Little Voice*. Since then, the Eureka, California, native has gone on to receive five GRAMMY® nominations including Song of the Year and Best Female Pop Vocal Performance for "Love Song." Bareilles' highly anticipated platinum sophomore release, *Kaleidoscope Heart*, debuted in September of 2010 at number one on the *Billboard* top 200 chart. The album yielded the hit single "King of Anything," which earned a GRAMMY® nomination for Best Female Pop Vocal Performance. In 2012, she released *Once Upon Another Time EP*, which was produced by singer-songwriter Ben Folds. Sara's acclaimed third studio album, *The Blessed Unrest*, was released in 2013 via Epic Records and debuted at number two on the *Billboard* album chart. She was nominated for two GRAMMY® Awards including Album of the Year and Best Pop Performance for her hit single "Brave." Sara's *New York Times* bestselling book, *Sounds Like Me: My Life (So Far) In Song*, was released in the fall of 2015. *What's Inside: Songs from Waitress*, her latest studio album, is out now featuring songs from the upcoming Broadway musical *Waitress*, which opens this April.
